EDITORIAL

In the vast savannahs of Africa and the dense jungles of Asia, a majestic giant roams – the elephant.

Elephants, both African and Asian species, confront multifaceted threats ranging from habitat loss and fragmentation to poaching and human-wildlife conflict. Rampant agricultural deforestation. driven bv expansion, urbanization, and infrastructure development, encroaches upon vital elephant habitats, leaving these majestic creatures with dwindling spaces to roam freely. habitats Fragmented exacerbate problem, isolating elephant populations and hindering genetic diversity, which is crucial for their long-term survival.

Poaching remains a pressing issue. particularly for African elephants, driven primarily by the insatiable demand for ivory in illegal markets. Despite international bans and intensified enforcement efforts. poachers continue to decimate elephant populations at an alarming rate, threatening not only the species' survival but also the ecological balance of their habitats.

Moreover, human-elephant conflict escalates as human populations expand into traditional elephant territories. Competition for resources such as water and food often leads to conflicts resulting in casualties on both sides.

DEPARTMENT ACTIVITY

The Department organized 'Pop Up Bazaar' as an activity of the Skill enhancement course – Bioentrepreneurship on 22nd December 2023. A total of 29 students participated in the activity and gained practical experience on selling of handmade goods and food items. The objective was to showcase the talent of students and provide them with a platform to display and sell their creations.
