

### FACULTY & STUDENT PARTICIPATION

Ms. Filomena Pereira and Ms. Neeha Sinai Borker, Assistant Professors, Department of Zoology actively participated in bird trails as a part of the Goa Bird Atlas Initiative organised by Arranya Environment Research Organisation (AERO) for Salcete and Tiswadi Taluka for the dry season in February 2024 and updated 34 checklists on e-bird as an effort towards the initiative.





Ms. Neeha Sinai Borker, Assistant Professor, Department of Zoology, attended an Online Webinar on "Beyond the Backyard: All About the Great Backyard Bird Count" organised by Cornell Lab of Ornithology on 14<sup>th</sup> Feb 2024. It highlighted the protocols for participating in the Great Backyard Bird Count and explored fun ways to involve kids in this experience.

Ms. Filomena Pereira and Ms. Neeha Sinai Borker, Assistant Professors along with the students of Department of Zoology participated in the Great Backyard Bird Count held on 18<sup>th</sup> February 2024 at Raia Wetland Complex, Goa. A total of 75 species were recorded, including rare sightings of Eurasian Wigeon and Bar-tailed Godwit.

Ms. Shalma Mascarenhas, Asst Professor, Department of Zoology was a resource person for the students of St. Thereza's Convent High School, Ganapoga Raia Goa on 19<sup>th</sup> Feb 2024. The topic for the session was "Wonders of Wildlife" and the same was conducted as a part of the "Vidnyan Dhara" a mega science series programme organised by the Directorate of Higher Education (DHE) and Goa State Higher Education Council (GSHEC).



Students of T.Y. visited to the infertility clinic and the anatomy museum of the Goa Medical College, Bambolim on 26th March 2024. The purpose of the visit was to provide students with firsthand insights into the clinical aspects of infertility management and Assisted Reproductive Techniques (ART).

#### EXPIRENTIAL SHARING

In mid-October, I received a photo from my mother of lizard eggs in our backyard, likely belonging to the oriental garden lizard. Usually, the mother lizard digs up a hole in the ground, lays eggs and covers it with soil to safeguard them. The mother lizard, in this case, left the eggs exposed because our dog, Simba, frightened it. Worried our dog might disturb them, I relocated the clutch to a container filled with loose soil. Over the next 53 days, I monitored the eggs, performing occasional candling. Despite one succumbing to fungus, six healthy lizards hatched on December 7th. Regrettably, two were lost to ant attacks. After briefly introducing them to our dog, Simba, I released the hatchlings back into the wild, concluding this exciting experience of incubating lizard eggs for the first time.
