THE APPLICATIONS OF NEUROPSYCHOLOGY

On 1st February 2024, the department of Psychology organized a talk on "The Applications of Neuropsychology" by Mr. Nathan Fernandes for the third year psychology students. The session aimed at updating students about the practical applications of neuropsychology and the current status of neuropsychological

research in India. The speaker talked about the invasive and non- invasive techniques in neuropsychology and its application in diagnosis and research, which was extremely insightful. The talk was supplemented with discussions about real, on field examples. The

speaker, who is associated with Christ (Deemed to be) University, Bangalore, provided students with information about the courses offered and the scope of Neuropsychology in India which helped the final year students explore their options for further study.

A JOURNEY OF LESSONS FROM REAL WORLD COGNITIVE EXPERIMENTS
