### FACULTY AS RESOURCE PERSON

**CAMPUS BIRD COUNT (CBC)** 

Dr. Nandini Vaz Fernandes, was invited as a resource person for a State level webinar on "Importance of Microbiology in Genetic Diagnosis" organised by Department of Microbiology of Govt. College of Arts, Science & Commerce, Khandola, Goa. The webinar was held in virtual mode on 23<sup>rd</sup> Feb 2021. The webinar was followed by interactive discussion session where the students and faculty from various colleges in Goa, interacted with her.



Chowgule's Birders Club of the Department of Zoology participated in the Campus Bird Count (CBC) which is a sub-event of the Great Backyard Bird Count (GBBC) hosted by the Cornell Lab or Ornithology. The students were guided by 03 faculty- Mr. Stephen Jonah Dias, Ms. Prasanna Naik Gaonkar and Ms. Pratibha Tripathi, from 12<sup>th</sup> -15<sup>th</sup> February 2021. A total of 38 bird species were identified during the survey.

### **EDITORIAL:**

White bellied Sea Eagle is a predatory bird that is mostly seen in small number along the coast, backwaters, and estuaries. They are usually seen circling over the waters to spot a prey fish or water snakes. Only one species of sea eagle, that is the White-Bellied Sea Eagle is found in Goa. Birds of this genus have long, broad wings, moderately long and rounded tails. These birds are dependent on water systems. They also feed on juvenile herons, egrets and storks in heronries like Salim Ali Bird Sanctuary, Chorao. It is protected under Schedule-I of the Indian Wildlife Protection Act of 1972. Recently in Goa, a white bellied Sea eagle was seized by the Goa forest Department on the basis of illegal captivity as these species of bird are protected under Schedule I, II, and IV of Wildlife Protection Act, 1972. The family from whom the bird was taken had it for around 7 years. The bird was found injured and was treated and domesticated by the family, unaware of its status under the wildlife protection act. The bird was habituated to the food provided to it and was unable to fly or prey. Seven years later the bird was taken away by the Forest Department, Goa and was kept at a Zoo.

What can be concluded from this entire incidence? *Did this act of protection provide ecological security?*

They conducted a 'Capacity Building Workshop: "Wildlife Management through GIS and GPS Technology" for 50 forest officials on 19th February 2021. Dr. Nandini Fernandes discussed various conventional and advanced geospatial tools used to monitor biodiversity such as ground surveys, aerial photography, radio telemetry, infrared camera trapping, remote sensing, GIS and GPS in monitoring wildlife. Mr. Stephen Dias explained the technicalities in the operation of camera traps and recording of metric data from pugmarks and use of M-STRIPES.

As the mode of entrance was Multiple Choice questions, I used a reference book containing sample papers for practicing and conducted self mock tests in order to build my confidence.
