MOVIE TIME

The History Forum screened two movies on two separate dates for a movie series called "World Wars Through A Lens".

The first movie to be screened was 1917, which is a long journey through the perilous death-strewn landscapes of WWI where the protagonists are tasked to carry an important message to stop an impending attack on the German lines by the British forces. The movie shows the true nature of war, its psychological effects on the human mind and how soldiers cope with it when they are on a mission of high priority. This movie is a historical fiction based on a relatively true story shared to the director, Sam Mendes, at a young age by his paternal grandfather, Alfred Mendes who fought on the western front for two years under the 1st battalion rifle brigade. The "story of the messenger" in the movie is reminiscent of the story told in Alfred Mendes's autobiography about his account of the battle of Poelcappelle.

The movie focuses on the confusion amidst a strategic German withdrawal for future offensives that led to major confusion amongst the British command as to whether or not the Germans surrendered. The movie portrays the landscape of the WWI well and its nightmarish nature, the clothing is accurate to the period, the speech and mannerisms reflect the era well and the much of the plot and events are also have a lot of historical precedence. Sam Mendes has successfully recreated a period of great peril and uncertainty into a timeless masterpiece with his unique style of cinematography.











The second movie screened was Beneath Hill 60 which focuses on an unseen side of WWI, the underground warfare. The trench warfare of the era, was bloody and grueling, with soldiers living in horrid conditions in wet ditches dug into the ground but the tunneling based warfare was brutal and claustrophobic. Soldiers had to spend days digging a couple of feet per day to achieve their desired mission in a hot and humid tunnel with little to no light at times. The risks of tunneling were grave, tunnel ceilings could collapse over a person, a cave-in could offer or the enemy could blow up your tunnel using carefully placed explosives, it was a battleground with unique characteristics and conundrums. The movie depicts the history of the events that transpired in the battle of Messiness and follows the story of Oliver Woodward, an Australian miner who has been assigned to lead the newly formed 1st Australian tunneling company which is meant to supplement the royal engineers.

The movie depicts Woodard's and his unit's actions during the Great War and the mental and physical fatigue they go through and how they cope with it. It is a largely unseen historical WWI film that focuses on an intricate portion of the Great War and depicts both the reality of the battle of messines

and tells the story of the miners turned soldiers who fought in it
