NEP Initiatives: Focus on Data analysis and Data science

With the implementation of the National Education Policy (NEP), the department has been able to introduce a range of unique courses that are not currently offered in other colleges across Goa. These courses have been designed with a greater focus on the practical application of teaching and learning. This approach involves the use of various software packages to provide students with hands-on training and skills.

Some of the unique courses that the department offers include Empirical Techniques in Economics, which utilizes Excel as a tool for data analysis. Data Analysis using Advanced Excel is another course that focuses on the use of advanced Excel functions to analyze and present data. Mathematical Techniques in Economics utilizes the software package Matlab to teach students about mathematical modelling. Another course, Introduction to Data Science: R and Python, provides students with an introduction to data science and the use of programming languages such as R and Python for data analysis. The Introduction to Econometrics course utilizes STATA and Gretl as tools to teach students about statistical models and data analysis. In addition to these courses, the department offers a range of other unique courses such as Home Economics, which teaches students about managing a household budget and other practical skills. Options Trading is a course that teaches students about financial markets and how to trade options. Transport Economics is a course that focuses on the economics of transportation systems, while Natural Resource Economics teaches students about the economics of natural resources. Social Sector Economics is a course that explores the economic aspects of social issues in society, while Behavioural Economics examines the psychological factors that influence economic decisions. Furthermore, Actuarial Economics teaches students about the application of statistical methods to assess risk and uncertainty in the insurance industry. Economics of Foreign Exchange is a course that explores the economics of international trade and foreign exchange markets, while Emerging Market Economies teaches students about the economics of developing countries. Regional Economics is a course that examines the economic factors that influence regional development and growth.

Overall, the department's unique courses provide students with a range of skills and knowledge that are highly applicable to the real world.

The use of secondary data will enable the students to have access to a broader range of information, which will help them develop a more in-depth understanding of their projects. The incorporation of secondary data with a large sample will also enhance the quality of research and analysis conducted by the students. This initiative by the department will undoubtedly contribute to the overall improvement of the quality of education offered to the students.


