The objectives of this years Discussion Forum were to sensitize students about psychological issues of aging, rights of older persons and legal bindings on family members toward them, and the daily challenges faced by the older persons and caregivers and ways in which the society can contribute.

WORLD MENTAL HEALTH DAY

The Department of Psychology celebrated World Mental Health Day on Monday, 10th October, on two fronts. Firstly, a talk for both teaching and non-teaching staff of the college was organized in the lower auditorium from 12.30 pm to 1.30 pm. Ms. Shobhika Jaju, mental health practitioner addressed the audience on the theme, 'Make mental health and well-being for all, a global priority'. She presented important statistics pertaining to mental health of Indians. She then spoke about the need to access mental health and ways to take care of one's own mental health.



Additionally, all students of the department presented posters on themes suggested by the World Federation of Mental Health. These posters were displayed and presented in the Quad, Corridor, Canteen and the area outside the canteen.


