2.14 Significant Activities and contributions made by IQAC

As per the annual academic plan laid down by the IQAC, the following activities were conducted. These activities can be categorized as follows.

a) Teaching Learning:

Besides the teaching learning modes already practiced, the IQAC introduced two New teaching-learning methodologies for this academic year. Induction Programme and Continuous in-house Training Programmes on various teaching-learning pedagogies like Blooms Taxonomy, Claap/Google Classroom and Content development for the newly appointed faculty were conducted. A two day workshop on “Flipped Learning” was conducted for faculty. Lastly, the Centre for Teaching Learning was established on 7th November, 2017 through the funding from RUSA. This Centre has an audio-visual room, flipped classroom and computer Lab. This Centre aims to train faculty in various teaching-learning methodologies, ICT tools, organise talks, seminars, conduct training programmes etc. (*Please See Annexure XVII*)

b) Research consultancy and extension activities

For the academic year 2017-18, the IQAC of the institution had taken multiple initiatives to further promote research in the institution. Workshops and seminars were conducted on ‘Funding bodies for availing research grants’, ‘Plagiarism in Academic Writing’, Research Data management – Orcid registration etc. As outcome of the initiatives, the research published and presented was increased. This year we recorded highest number of research projects funded by various bodies. Research portal was launched on the college website which served as E-database of research at the institution. 06 departments of the college were selected for funding under STAR College Scheme of DBT, Govt of India, making us the first college in Goa to be funded under this Scheme. There was considerable increase in the extension activities and Community outreach activities as this year departments also took the initiatives to conduct activities for community besides the NSS and NCC."

c) Enhancement and Enrichment of Human resource

Apart from academic and research activities, there was emphasis on Human Resource Development. It was channelized through workshops, counselling session and training programme. There were two prominent workshops of “Conflict Management and Conflict Mediation’ by international faculty, Mrs Ana Martins, Psychologist, University of Porto, Portugal and Prof. Patrick McNamara, Director of International Studies and Programme, University of Nebraska, Omaha.

For the non-teaching, a training on computer literacy, health camp and awareness programmes were conducted and for the students, Chowgules Youth Entrepreneurship’, a two-day programme was conducted in association with Pai Foundation, Mumbai.

Various committees organized awareness programs like prevention of sexual harassment at work place, Zero based budgeting, academic related programs and activities.

Lastly, at the end of the year IQAC conducted 'Positive Chowgules' where every department presented best practises of their department.

In view of the report of the academic audit the governing body suggested to reduce the quantum of syllabus and accordingly across all courses the syllabus was by 20per cent, to increase the rigour and participation of students for the in-depth study of the course. This step was taken in view of the feedback received from various stakeholders.

As per the governing body recommendation to enhance the teaching-learning and evaluation processes, the IQAC prepared handbook describing the different modes of T-L-E processes to be adopted by the college. Different T-L-E methods documented to cater to the different types of learners in the classroom/field.

Considering the outcome of Academic audit and following the recommendation of the Governing body, the Board of studies of every subject have revised their syllabi. The revision also incorporated the suggestions from various stakeholders in view of need of employment sectors.

The salient features were:

- a. Reduction of theory component of syllabus to enable in-depth study of the courses.
- b. The number of practicals were reduced from 15 to 8-10 per semester.
- c. Project based practicals were introduced to enable students to understand application of the course.
- d. Certain courses were reorganised based on the level of difficulty.

2.6 Innovative processes adopted by the institution in Teaching and Learning:

The various teaching-learning methodologies used in the Institution over the past few years were Experiential Learning through Constructivist model, Application model, use of Audio lecture, Group discussions, Case Studies, Debates, Problem Based Learning, Traditional Lecture Method, Field based Learning, Blended Learning, Creation of Role plays and Street plays too were extensively used across the Departments.

Besides these the innovative processes that were implemented during the academic year 2017-2018 were:

- POGIL (Process Oriented Guided Inquiry Learning).

POGIL is a student-centred, group-learning instructional strategy and philosophy developed through research on how students learn best. This method is now widely being used by most members of faculty in Chemistry and Computer Science Department.

- Flipped Learning

Flipped Learning is implemented by using Cooperative Learning Strategies such as Think-Pair-Share and Round Table. This method is practiced by the departments of Geology, English, Sociology, Biotechnology and Psychology. With an intention to encourage research culture in the students at UG level itself, the second year students under the Research Writing component are made to refer

research papers in their respective subjects and to prepare a summary report which then is evaluated by the department faculty.

- ‘Positive Chowgules’ an annual event for all faculty members in the College that showcases the Best Practices with respect to Teaching-Learning and Innovation in each Department was held.

- Some of the New Evaluation methods adopted this academic year were:
 - Submission-based projects using portfolio method/ term papers (Semester End Exam);
 - Flexibility for use of different Modes for evaluation at Continuous Assessment (CA) was encouraged (This is explained further in section 2.8 of this report that follows).

2.8 Examination/ Evaluation Reforms initiated by the Institution (for example: Open Book Examination, Bar Coding, Double Valuation, Photocopy, Online Multiple Choice Questions)

The students are assessed on a regular basis through ‘Continuous Assessment’ and ‘Semester End Examination’. In adopting such a model, the student is expected to remain in touch with the courses that he/she has opted for. Moreover, a course teacher exercises the freedom to assess a student using various modes such as MCQs, assignments, presentations, review of research papers, group discussions, viva etc. Also, certain courses are evaluated based on portfolios prepared and submitted by the students at the end of a course. Such courses may involve field-based experiential learning. Faculty and Students use LMS (Learning Management System) Like CLAAP (Chowgules Learn Anytime Any Place) and Google Classroom for all their Teaching-Learning and Evaluation processes throughout the Academic Year.

The methods adopted for evaluation particularly in the ‘Continuous Assessment’ for theory component of the course, vary among the department. These include open book examination, paper review, digital short story telling, term papers, portfolios, documentary film-making.

For courses in practicals, the assessment is done on a regular basis by evaluating the conduct and performance of a student in the laboratory. No separate examination is held in this regard. E-journals were uploaded by Faculty on a regular basis.

Internship trainings are initiated and coordinated by departments and recorded with the college administration.

2.12 How does IQAC Contribute/Monitor/Evaluate the Teaching & Learning processes:

The IQAC in its regular meetings discusses, deliberates and contributes suggestions and mechanisms in an open manner issues pertaining to maintaining quality in education in the Institution. The student performance at the End Semester exams act as feeders to monitoring the progress of the student academically. Further, the internships, placement and admissions to post-graduate courses act as indicators to evaluate the effectiveness of the extracurricular activities, electives and other credits/papers offered by the Institution.

The IQAC with an aim to encourage departments to evaluate their “education quality processes” – offered through the various courses that are run by the departments introduced the method of conducting an Academic Audit. This Academic Audit is required to produce, assure, and regularly monitor and improve the quality of teaching and learning.

An Academic Audit is a basic component of the system of Academic Autonomy. Its purpose is to establish a process of self-appraisal as to how the academic programmes and initiatives of the College are being executed by individual teachers. It aims at verifying if the academic programmes and initiatives are in tune with the Vision and Mission of the College and if the conditions and requirements set by the Board of Studies and the Academic Council are being met.

The Academic Audit encompasses the implementation of the teaching-learning-evaluation processes, the contribution towards achieving the vision and mission of the College and the participation in the extension activities of the Department and the College.

The purpose of an Academic Audit therefore as envisaged by the IQAC is to encourage departments to evaluate their own courses. This year too, the Academic Audit was taken up as a process for improvement and up gradation of the courses within the adopted autonomous system.

The IQAC prepared an Audit Form that was to be filled individually by every faculty for each paper that was being taught in every semester. This duly filled in Academic Audit form broadly covered qualitative and quantitative data in areas pertaining to teaching-learning methods used; syllabus content, coverage and delivery mechanisms; evaluation methodologies used; research and innovation. The Audit form also aims to incorporate teacher-students comments/suggestions, if any with focus towards improvement and enhancement of quality of teaching-learning. This duly filled in Academic Audit form along with supporting documents and evidences is then submitted by each faculty to the Audit Committee in person.

3. Research, Consultancy and Extension

3.1 Initiatives of the IQAC in Sensitizing/Promoting Research Climate in the institution:

As research is identified as one of the key focus for the institution, short term and long-term goals were purposefully identified to streamline works and events to be organised to promote research on campus. For the academic year 2017-18, the IQAC of the institution had taken multiple initiatives to further promote research in the institution.

- Research committee meetings were convened with faculty members to encourage research proposals. They were explained the institutional policies for encouraging research. As outcome of the establishment of ‘Research Discussion Forum’ (RDF) by the research committee in 2016-17, the institution managed to initiate research links and submit 03 interdisciplinary project proposals for obtaining funds.
- The sanctioned and ongoing research grants for 2017-2018 was 10, the highest recorded in the college over past years. 06 minor and 02 major Project proposals were submitted for availing funding for academic year 2017-18. New sanctioned projects included 04 proposals by DHE-DST, 02 grants received from ICSSR and 1 from DST.
- The college was also looking towards up-gradation of research infrastructure and development of research aptitude of teachers and students and create scientific temperament. In view of this proposal for ‘DBT Star College Scheme’ was submitted. Six UG science departments of College were thereafter selected for funding under this scheme, making us the first college in Goa to be funded under STAR College Scheme by DBT.
- Another important achievement of 2017-18 was establishment of E-database of research. The research portal was introduced on the college website. The database harbours research policies, research infrastructure, projects, and publications etc. of the institute. Various documents are also made available on the portal for faculty members and students pertaining to research ethics, funding bodies etc.
- Research Publications: Articles in refereed journals and books are the main form of communication in research. The average paper publications, conferences /seminars/workshops attended or organised etc showed increase for the academic year 2017-2018. There were 32 research papers that were presented in international/national/state level conferences. 31 research papers were published in international/national and state journals and proceedings.
- Workshops/ seminars: Initiatives towards spread of awareness on research ethics was manifested through conduct of seminars/ talks for faculty members. 18 guest lectures were organised by various departments as part of academia- industrial interactions for knowledge enrichment. Our faculty members were also invited as resource persons for 18 sessions/conferences.

- Extension activities and Community services: 46 extension activities were conducted by various departments. The college conducts various programmes and activities to address the need of social responsibility. Multiple activities and programmes were organised to sensitize students to the social issues and Inculcate values and commitment to society, by the NSS unit of the college as well as by the departments.

NSS unit of the college conducted 31 activities and departments organised 24 community outreach activities.

- Linkages and MoUs: New linkages were created by various departments for the purpose of internships. 06 new MoUs were signed for this year. 12 new linkages were created for the purpose of research and internships.
- Consultancy: Faculty members also undertake consultancy works based on their area of expertise. Income generated through consultancy was 1.8 lakhs.

The department of Zoology conducted various awareness programmes related to health and environment as departmental social responsibility towards the community of Raia, Gogol, Navelim, Davorlim, Quepem and Mangor Hill Vasco. - i. **Blood Donation:** Students of Zoology department (UG and PG), donated blood for the blood bank of ‘Rajagiri Victor Hospital’ Margao Goa. on 14th December 2017.
- ii. **Motivation for Blood Donation (05/04/18):** The aim of the program was to spread awareness about blood donation and motivate people to donate blood. The activity consisted of a preliminary questionnaire which gave an account of the current status of frequency of the people donating blood. People were explained about the benefits of blood donation and motivated to donate blood in future.
- iii. **Kitchen Waste Management and Compost (07/04/18):** The aim of the program was to spread awareness about segregation and composting of kitchen waste from households. The activity consisted of a preliminary questionnaire which gave an account of the current waste

management status in the households. Brief step wise protocol for easy composting at home was explained to the members of the family by the students.

- iv. **Vitamin D Deficiency (09/04/18):** The aim was to spread awareness about the vitamin D deficiency, its causes and consequences. Deficiency of vitamin D can lead to serious health issues and therefore to make people aware about the vitamin D deficiency, its causes and consequence, this activity was undertaken. Handout on food items and source of vitamin D was given to each house.
- v. **Nutrition Requirement of Children (10/04/18):** The aim was to explain the dietary intake essential for the proper physical and mental growth of children. A worksheet was prepared to collect data on the amount of protein, carbohydrate, fats, vitamins and mineral intake of the child. The families were explained about the nutritional requirements of children. Chart of nutrition requirement according to age was given to each house.
- vi. **Sanitary Hygiene (13/04/18):** The program aimed to create awareness about the importance sanitary hygiene. A questionnaire was prepared and put forth to the women with an aim to understand the present scenario of the sanitary hygiene. The women were explained about care and hygienic practices during menstruation.
- vii. **Garbage Segregation (13/04/18):** The program aimed to create awareness about the importance garbage disposal and segregation. Methods of disposal of organic and inorganic wastes were explained.

32. Green Campus initiatives:

- i. The college organises events as part of Swachh Bharat by NSS. Besides this, the departments of geography, botany and zoology have also initiated activities towards green campus by having weather station on campus, green house, and documentation of biodiversity on campus etc.
- ii. For academic year 2017-18, the department of Zoology inaugurated 'Butterfly garden' on campus which harbours various host plants of butterflies. With prior planning initiated in the month of July 2017, the final execution was completed and inaugurated on 2nd October 'Swachh

Bharat Divas' 2017. Relevance of Butterfly garden in ensuring clean environment are multiple. Besides being pollinators of many plants, they also serve as important part of the food chain. The most important feature is that Butterflies serve as an 'Ecosystem barometer' which tells us about the health of our environment. These creatures are sensitive to changes in climate, the presence of harmful chemicals, pollution in the air and water, and any other changes in the environment. Presence of many species of butterflies on our campus is an indication that the Chowgule college campus is clean and healthy.

- iii. The department of Zoology also installed 'Bird houses' on the campus on 13th Feb 2018. This was an initiative to promote faunal diversity on campus and sensitise students towards conservation and protection of biodiversity.

5. Student Support and Progression

5.1 Contribution of IQAC in enhancing awareness about Student Support Services.

The IQAC initiated various avenues to create awareness about student support services on the campus. The college has ‘Student Support service centre’ and ‘Office of Information Technology’ which are also involved in extending support to the students. The college adopts the following:

- ‘Open seminar- Know the College’ is conducted for the parents and prospective students which is intimated via newspapers, website, hoardings etc.
- Three-day induction program was conducted for the students to orient them about the facilities available on the campus for students.
- In the first mentoring program all the mentors/faculty advisors discuss the details about the availability of facilities related to ICT, learning, examination, exchange programmes, sports etc.
- The campus has hoardings and standees indicating the facilities on campus.
- The website also harbours information about various schemes and facilities for students.
- Students are provided with e-handbook.

5.2 Efforts made by the institution for tracking the progression

The college has devised processes and mechanism to monitor the progression of the students at various levels. The mechanisms include the following:

a) Academic progression during the course/programme:

- Grade tracking and target setting for students. The students admitted to various courses are required to set targets towards their performance at each semester and their progress vis-a-vis the set target is monitored at the mentor-mentee meetings. An analysis thereon is done of the results achieved by students; a report in this regard is submitted to the respective departments to monitor their progress.

b) Vertical mobility progression:

- The office maintains the record of all outgoing students who seek admission for post graduate studies in various institutions.
- An online portal is developed in Alumni section to gather information on the same.
- Department also maintains records of the further progression of the students.

Criterion – VI**6. Governance, Leadership and Management****6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution**

VISION: “To be among global leaders in imparting relevant education of highest standards in a disciplined and conducive environment”.

MISION: “To continue to be pioneers of change using cutting edge educational inputs and technology, providing equal opportunities to all and inculcating social and moral values that will transform society and the nation at large”.

6.2 Does the Institution has a management Information System

Yes, the Institution has *Management Information System* for academic and administrative processes of the college. These MISs are developed in-house by ‘office of Information’ (OIT) and Department of Computer Science. The College maintains a directory of its entire staff apart from having provided all with a unique institution generated email ID. All communications related to academic and administrative activities are conveyed via email. Also, all the students have domain specific email IDs. This information system is employed towards, online admissions, updating of learning resources (Moodle based), booking of college facilities, notifications on mentoring programme and other related aspects. Details are mentioned in section 4.2 of this document.

Enhancing areas of E-governance in academic and administrative processes was an initiative to reduce use of paper, increase efficiency, analyse data, help in future planning, and take effective and timely decisions.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:**6.3.1 Curriculum Development**

The institution has a mechanism to constantly revise curriculum with the inputs of stakeholders. The Board of Studies in each subject has members from other reputed institutions, industry and alumni besides the department faculty. Suggestions and recommendations from all are incorporated in the syllabi of a course after thorough discussions, keeping in mind the demands of the day in industry and society in general. Accordingly, some of the courses are designed for skill development and career

progression of students. This academic year in view of the feedback received after Academic audit, the governing body suggested to reduce the quantum of syllabus and accordingly across all courses. The syllabus was reduced up to 20 per cent, to increase the rigour and participation of students for the in-depth study of the course. *Details are discussed in section 2.15 and 1.4 of Criteria 1.*

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning:

The faculty are encouraged to adopt innovation in their routine teaching. The college has provided LCD facilities in every classroom and Laboratories as most of the faculty employs power point presentations in their regular teaching. Also, field experience is provided to relate basic concepts to natural settings. Emphasis is also laid on coordinated teaching-learning through various student centric learning methods viz. group discussions, Problem based learning, POGIL, assignment writing etc.

As per the governing body recommendation to enhance the teaching learning and evaluation processes, the IQAC prepared handbook describing the different modes of T-L-E processes to be adopted by the college. Different T-L-E methods were documented to cater to the different types of learners in the classroom/field.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

To ensure a gradual progression of a student the college adopts innovative methods in assessing the students.

- In accordance with this the faculty exercises the freedom to evaluate a student under “continuous assessment” adopting various modes; a semester end examination is conducted and assessed through assessment system, results are processed and declared on the college website.
- During this year, the number of mandatory assessments (continuous assessments-CA) were reduced from three to two (CA). This was adopted to provide more time to the students to evolve greater quality at the assessments.
- Another reform implemented was with reference to the passing criteria. The passing criteria was independently applied to the CAs and Semester end component. This was done to ensure quality in performance throughout the semester.
- Handbook on various mode of assessments was prepared by the IQAC.

6.3.4 Research and Development:

Various strategies were adopted to enhance and promote research amongst faculty members and students. For the academic year 2017-18, the IQAC of the institution had taken multiple initiatives to further promote research in the institution. Workshops and seminars were conducted on ‘Funding bodies for availing research grants’, ‘Plagiarism in Academic Writing’, Research Data management – Orcid registration etc. As outcome of the initiatives, the research published and presented was increased. This year we recorded highest number of research projects funded by various bodies. Research portal was

launched on the college website which served as E-database of research at the institution. Various research related documents and research policies are made available on the research portal for the reference of students and faculty. With the intention of strengthening the lab infrastructure and enhance the research the college applied for Star DBT Scheme. 06 departments of the college were selected for funding under STAR College Scheme of DBT, Govt of India, making us the first college in Goa to be funded under this Scheme. There was considerable increase in the extension activities and Community outreach activities as this year departments also took the initiatives to conduct activities for community besides the NSS and NCC.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The college prepares estimate budget of financial requirement for the maintenance and upgradation of the Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation. This budget is presented to the management by the principal for the approval. Accordingly, works are undertaken as per the budget allocation.

The college also makes efforts to apply to various funding agencies, to receive financial assistance for strengthening existing infrastructure the college. With the intention of strengthening the lab infrastructure and enhance the research, the college applied for Star DBT Scheme.

Proposal was also submitted to the directorate of Higher Education (DHE) Goa, for funding under RUSA grants. Accordingly, in the first phase a grant of 100 lakhs was received, which was used for buying new equipments, maintenance of infrastructure and construction.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

The IQAC conducted orientations/seminars/ workshops for human resource management.

The institute retains and recruits dynamic faculty who has potential to progress in teaching, is research oriented, and involved in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. The recruitment process is governed by UGC and state government regulations. The selection process is attuned towards recruiting competent and committed faculty. The college has a Human Resource (HR) section to look into the modalities of the recruitment process.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

The college under the autonomous status has continued to follow standard guidelines of the Goa University and follows necessary procedures laid down by the directorate of Higher Education in the recruitment of staff and faculty with selection being done solely on merits.

- Planning: Vacancies are decided according to student enrolment, introduction of new courses or super annuation of teachers. The requirement of faculty / staff for recruitment is advertised on the advice of the Head of a Department in accordance with calculated workload. Advertising of posts is done in national and local newspapers, as well as on the College website.

- **Recruitment:** The Selection Committee is constituted as per the statutes of the Goa University SC-5. The Selection Committee consists of the following personnel.
 - a. Chairman of the Governing Body of the College or his/her nominee to be Chairperson of the Selection Committee.
 - b. Principal of the College.
 - c. One senior teacher/Head of the Department (of the concerned subject) preferably having not less than 10 years of service as a teacher.
 - d. Two nominees of the Vice-Chancellor of the affiliating University of whom one should be a subject expert.
 - e. Two subject experts not connected with the college to be nominated by the Chairperson of the Governing Body out of a panel of names approved by the Vice-Chancellor.
- The College practices the policy of equal opportunity for all, there is no discrimination done based on religion/ community / caste / gender. The selection of candidates is done through interviews of the candidates by the Committee members and is purely based on merit. The college has a high number of female members. The male to female ratio is 42:58. Individuals from different religions, caste and community represent the faculty of the college.
- Besides providing secretarial support to some departments for administration, those involved in active research are provided with the services of Research Assistants. Under the 'Earn while you Learn' scheme, students help is derived by the faculty in research work.
- Management acknowledges contributions of faculty and has constituted awards under categories like:
 - a. Best Teacher - Award for Excellence in Research & Consultancy
 - b. Best Teacher - Award for Excellence in Student Related Activities
 - c. Best Teacher - Award for Public Relations

6.9 What efforts are made by the University/ Autonomous College for Examination Reforms?

Under Autonomous structure, the students are assessed on a regular basis termed as 'Continuous Assessment' (CA) and at the end of a semester through 'Semester End Examination' (SEE). The weightage in percentage is 40 and 60 respectively.

The “Continuous Assessment” is done using modes such as written/oral examinations, open/closed book tests, Scheduled/ Surprise test, objective / multiple choice questions; assignments, report on field visit observations, Short-answer type, Essay type, Seminar, Assignment, Experimental work, Journal paper Review, Fieldwork, Viva-Voce, Peer group assessment, etc.

For courses having practicals, the assessment is done on a regular basis by evaluating the conduct and performance of a student in the laboratory. The daily assessment is based on the rubric of assessment prepared by the course faculty. The student’s are made aware of their performance. To bring in transparency, internal assessments are shown to the students followed by discussion on their shortcoming.

7.1 Innovations introduced during this academic year which have created a positive impact on the functioning of the institution. Give details.

1. Encouraging students to generate ideas for Entrepreneurship / start-ups:

The College has conducted various activities to promote entrepreneurship and encourage a start-up culture amongst students:

- An “**Innovative Mobile App Idea Competition**” was organized by the Department of Computer Science for Computer Science, B.Voc. And M.Sc. IT. Students on 4th Sept 2017. Top 10 ideas were shortlisted for final presentation before a panel of judges (one of the judges was from *Centre for Incubation and Business Acceleration, Goa*). Best three ideas were finally awarded on 27th September 2017. The concept was to encourage students to think and utilise their knowledge in the subject to be put to practice that subject would be useful to the society.
- An *interactive session* on “**Start Your Start-up**” by an alumni, Mr. Rohit Naik, founder and CEO at Third Eye Technologies, Ponda was organized for the students of Computer Science Department on 24th January 2018. The resource person emphasized on adopting entrepreneurship over a job, and highlighted his journey as an entrepreneur and advised students to formulate ideas and to put in efforts to bring them to reality.
- The College in association with *Don Bosco College of Engineering and Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India* (EDII) organized three days ‘**Entrepreneurship Awareness Camp**’ for students from 26th to 28th January, 2018. The resource person gave a motivational talk on the achievements of young entrepreneurs and gave tips on how to encourage their students in taking up start-ups.
- e. Faculty members of the Departments of Biotechnology and Biochemistry attended a *Mentoring Seminar for Entrepreneurs and Innovators* on **“Government Grants & Funding Opportunities”** on 6th February, 2018 at CIBA, Verna, Goa. The resource person was Ms. Amruta Gore, Asst. Manager, Impact projects, Venture Centre, Pune. Stressed on the need to create & increase awareness on funding opportunity in the biotechnology and healthcare space, viz. the DBT-BIRAC Biotech Ignition Grant (BIG) scheme, NIDHI-EIR & PRAYAS as also, the application process, funding process-flow, guidance on writing winning proposals etc.
- f. One member each from the faculties of Computer Science and Biotechnology attended SPJIMR's Annual flagship entrepreneurial event **‘Lock Stock Trade’** on 13th January 2018. This event was aimed to provide an exposure on Social Ventures, Flourishing Ventures, Budding Ventures and the Fintech + Techno-logy start-ups.
- g. Students of computer science and Software development (Voc) along with M.Sc. (part II) students visited **‘Centre for Incubation and Business Acceleration (CIBA) in Verna’** on 02nd August 2017. The Objective was to understand the functioning and the support provided by their personnel in the process of individual ideas leading to start-up/s. The faculty members of the department also had an interactive session with Mr. B.S. Revankar, Ex. Director at Centre for Entrepreneurship Development, Karnataka.
- h. A *talk* on **‘Legal compliance for Business and Intellectual Property Rights’** by Ms. Gautami Raiker, Founder of Lawmate, presently incubated at CIBA Verna, Goa was held on 27th April 2018 to enlighten members of the faculty on the importance of trademark, copyrights and

patents. In her talk she Highlighted the difficulties, shortcomings and advantages of registration and the procedures involved in the process of setting up of a start-up.

- i. *Shri Shirish Kotmire* has been appointed by the College as a Consultant to develop innovative ideas into structured start-ups. From the several meetings and interactive sessions, the departments of Botanny and Biotechnology have initiated new start-ups. As a first outcome of this venture. *Mr. Shane Quadros* student of Biotechnology has started a, company named '**OFresco**' that would provide healthy eating options in the form of fresh fruits and vegetable salads.

2. Teaching learning syllabus/curriculum:

Through the curriculum adopted by the college and the syllabi of the courses in a subject on outcome-based learning has been mooted. Imparting as well as innovative methods during lectures and in the conduct of practical's has remained the focal point of the institution. Students are trained towards self study through assignments, projects and are also oriented towards research.

3. Interpersonal developmental workshops organized by the college:

- a. A *workshop* on '**Conflict Mediation**' by Ms. Ana Martins, (Psychologist) was conducted for faculties to learn and validate specific skills, such as cooperative negotiation, assertiveness, communication, active listening, creativity and problem solving, which are important tools that can promote the improvement of interpersonal relationships and pedagogical methods.
- b. A *workshop* on '**Research Publication Data Management**' was conducted for helping researchers to connect themselves with global platforms like web of Science and Scopus and to enable researchers to track their research work or achievements. The workshop demonstrated the procedure involved in registering and uploading information and research works on the global platform.
- c. A *workshop* on '**Zero Based Budgeting**' was conducted by Dr. E. Mericio Travassos, Vice Principal and Head of the Department of Economics to enable the academic departments and others to prepare efficient budgets, develop an objective basis of decision-making, control costs, provide a linkage between programme goals and expenses, and prioritize expenses in the context of scarcity of funds.

4. Project orientation from Seniors to juniors through the event 'PrernaDiwas':

As an innovative method and as a measure of confidence building in students, the project works undertaken by the Third year students were displayed / presented in the form of posters and models. The objective was to provide a platform for these students to showcase their work and develop a confidence in presenting their works to an audience, another important objective was to instil a thinking in the second-year students to prepare themselves for taking up such projects

during their tenure. Thus the Third year students are exposed to broad guidelines in selecting a topic for their project.

5. Inviting resource persons to deliver subject related talks/lectures for students and faculties:

Subject-based talks are encouraged by the college as it allows each department to widen their scope of teaching and learning. Most departments invite resource persons practising in the field, to deliver talks, lectures and provide hands-on training. This also, enlightens the students about the subject more practically as they get to interact and discuss any issues related to their subject directly with such resource persons. *Refer Annexure IX*

7.2. Provide the Action Taken Report (ATR) based on the plan of action decided upon at the beginning of the year

The following task were planned and completed during for the year 2017- 2018.

1. To develop specialised centres: The college established two centres -
 - a. Centre for Translation - To cater to the needs of the Faculty of Languages and bridge the gap between cultures through translation.*Refer to AnnexureXVI.*
 - b. Centre for Teaching Learning - to cater to the needs of the college and its evolving requirements of teaching and learning techniques and its impact on evaluations.*Refer to AnnexureXVII.*
2. Human resource: The college focussed on increasing its strength in faculty, while also investing in faculty development through Workshops, Training in adopting innovative Teaching -Learning techniques, as well as cataloguing the innovative evaluation techniques being practised by teachers in their departments. This was presented during the Positive Chowgule session organized by the college. *See Annexure XIII*
3. Promotion of research: the college acquired grants under **DBTStar CollegeScheme** (the only college in Goa to have received so), and encouraged research through formulation of institutional research policies, establishment of research discussion forum to encourage interdisciplinary research, organization of workshops for teachers on 'Research Publication Data Management' and 'Funding Bodies for Research Grants'. A research portal was also created for the college website containing research data of the research infrastructure, projects, publications, and research policies and guide to funding bodies etc. The IQAC of the college proposed research awards and grants for teachers to conduct commendable research in their respective fields.
4. Development of infrastructure: College has developed the Centre for Teaching Learning which includes an AV Room, a computer Laboratory and Classroom for flipped learning (model classroom), apart from regular maintenance of existing infrastructure.

Standardised Practises to ensure quality of Teaching-Learning and Evaluations:

A well-defined plan for each course, course outline and pre-class reading through the Flipped Learning Methodology that is facilitated through CLAAP and Google Classroom is being adopted as a policy by the college keeping in view the confidentiality involved in the organization and conduct of a Semester End written exam every teacher prepare two sets of internal question papers in accordance with Bloom’s taxonomy along with detailed answer keys. Marking schemes / rubrics are devised for courses having submission-based Semester end exams, Term

Papers based SEEs, or portfolio based SEEs. Through a Central Evaluation System of assessing and cross-checking of scores the results are prepared using automated software. An academic audit conducted at the end of a year intends to monitor the entire process of delivery of a course.

Complementary practices to academics – Value added Services, Research-based education, and Student Academic Tracking:

Certificate courses and value-added courses are offered to students through CCAPS (Chowgule Center for Applied and Professional Studies) besides some of the departments in the faculty of Arts the departments. An analysis of the results of the students is done and a tracking of the grades set in advance by the students is monitored through a mentoring system apart from that done at the department level. As a part of promoting a research culture amongst students, an encouragement is given to students to present their work related to projects either as papers or as posters at relevant forums.

Practice II: International Exchange Programme

The college has instituted Exchange Programmes with institutes beyond the boundaries of the country. These programmes function at the following levels:

- a) Student & Faculty Cultural Exchange Programme (with Project Collaborations)
- b) Student Academic Exchange Programme & International Student Project Guidance
- c) Faculty Academic Exchange Programme
- d) MOUs with International institutes, Visits and Bilateral Programmes

The aim is commensurate with the vision and mission of the college to give opportunities to all, while endeavouring to be global leaders in education.

Student & Faculty Cultural Exchange Programme

The exchange programme with Swedish institutions aims to establish collaboration between the students and faculty of the respective institutions and provides an opportunity to understand the culture, traditions, food and socio-economic life in Sweden. The history, biodiversity and other aspects of Sweden are covered through lectures and enhanced through field trips.

As part of the Sweden Exchange Programme 2017-18, 18 students and three faculty member of the college, Mr. Kumaresh Pillai, Ms. Liesl Silva and Ms. Sharmila Menezes visited *Tullinge* and *Bromma* Gymnasium, Stockholm, Sweden from 6th September to 22nd September, 2017. Our students stayed with the Swedish students who were selected to reciprocate the visit to Chowgule College in November-December, 2017. The students attended lectures on Swedish history, cultural exchange, flora and fauna, preservation biology, equality and so on. They visited important historical locations in and around as a part of the exchange programme. Students also gave a performance on 'India Day' that was organized to showcase Indian Culture.

On a reciprocal visit, 18 students and five faculty from Tullinge and Bromma Gymnasiums, visited Parvitibai Chowgule College from 25th November to 8th December, 2017. Swedish students stayed with families of our students to experience Indian social life. The programme schedule included sessions on yoga, interactive lectures on 'Goan Heritage', 'Industries in Goa', 'Livelihood strategies of Tribal's in Goa', 'Ethnic Medicines', 'Goan Cuisine' and 'Indian Classical Dance/Music'. Students were taken on field visits to orphanage, old age home, and other institutes and houses that court Goa's cultural heritage.

Projects Collaborations

During the academic year 2017 – 2018, the research component of the programme included two projects carried out by our students and members of faculty in collaboration with *Tullinge* gymnasium (Stockholm, Sweden). A brief account of the projects is provided below:

- *A preliminary comparative analysis of soil microbes in Goa and Sweden*

The project was aimed at conducting a preliminary microbial analysis of soil samples from Sweden and Goa and to compare the microbial colonies formed along specific parameters.

It was interesting to note that while the microbial colonies from soil samples in both countries displayed similarities in size, texture and pigmentation, there were differences in the type of margin and in the optical property, indicating that the species found in these regions vary from each other. Further characterization tests would reveal information with respect to Gram character, biochemical nature, motility and other characteristics of the soil microbes.

Student Academic Exchange Programme

- a) Ms. Aarati Joshi, SYBA (English/French Major) got selected at Waseda University, Japan for a one year course in advanced Japanese language during academic year 2017-18 under the academic exchange programme. She was awarded JASSO scholarship to complete her course over the year.
- b) Ms. Charmaine Pereira, SYBA (English Major) was selected to pursue her study at Kansai University, Japan for two semesters for the year 2018 – 2019 under the Student Academic exchange programme.
- c) Dr. Nandkumar Sawant guided and mentored Ms. Kata Murányi, a Research Scholar from Institute of Geography, University of Pécs, Hungary for her Short Study on 'Creative Economy of the Portuguese Speaking Countries and Territories, Ex-colonies', 31st December 2017 to 16th January 2018. - d) Dr. Nandkumar Sawant provided guidance to Ms. Klara Nordström, a Graduate Student from University of Stockholm, Sweden, for her Research Project on 'Tourism and Women Empowerment', 16th January to 16th March 2018.

Faculty Academic Exchange Programme

Under this initiative the college endeavours to associate and bring in foreign faculty members to give our students an edge. This is in its initial stages and therefore has seen foreign faculties and delegates visiting the institute.

- a) Professor Gilda Machado from Portugal is providing her services to this college and is in-charge of the department of Portuguese and conducted the Portuguese Language Course for 78 students for the full academic year.
- b) Prof. Jose Manuel Peres Jorge, University of Porto, Portugal visited the Department of Economics, from 7th to 19th August, 2017. He addressed the students of Economics on exchange rate systems and international banking and exchange rate and international resource management.
- c) His Excellency, Mr. Hai Kwang Lee, Acting Ambassador of Republic of Korea (South Korea) to India, visited the college on 27th of October, 2017 to give a talk on Korea-India relations as a part of the Embassy's public diplomacy programme. His lecture touched upon deep historical and cultural linkages between the two countries that date back more than two thousand years. He added that Korea's focus on education is significant and showed keen interest in strengthening bilateral relations between the two countries in collaborative research and higher education.
- d) Prof. Paula Guerra from University of Porto, Portugal visited the Dept. of Sociology, from 30th January to 12th February, 2018. She took up lectures on *Sociology of Religion* and *Introduction to Schools of Sociological Theory* for the sociology students. Prof. Guerra also conducted a workshop on *Introduction to Qualitative Research* for students and members of faculty of the college.
- e) Professor Christopher Gallager, from International Christian University, Japan taught a course: Academic Writing for the academic year 2017-18. He also conducted few workshop and was the resource person for the National Conference
- f) A *workshop* on '**Conflict Mediation**' by Ms. Ana Martins, (Psychologist) was conducted for faculties to learn and validate specific skills, such as cooperative negotiation, assertiveness, communication, active listening, creativity and problem solving, which are important tools that can promote the improvement of interpersonal relationships and pedagogical methods. Similarly, Dr Patrick Mc Namara conducted a workshop on Art of Meditating.

They jointly presented a paper on ‘Goa’s Urban Landscape: does it retain Lusophone Identity?’

 - iii. 'Groundwater conditions and its quality in Cuncolim Village, Salcete, Goa': A study in and around industrial area at Cuncolim and its awareness to the community was undertaken.

12. Department of Zoology: 10

The department of Zoology conducted various awareness programmes related to health and environment as departmental social responsibility towards the community of Raia, Gogol, Navelim, Davorlim, Quepem and Mangor Hill Vasco. For each activity at least 60 houses were targeted. The activities were conducted by TYBSc students under the guidance of Dr. Nandini, Ms. Madhu, Ms. Tessa, Ms. Andrea and Ms. Ashneha.

- ix. **Blood Donation:** Students of Zoology department (UG and PG), donated blood for the blood bank of 'Rajagiri Victor Hospital' Margao Goa. on 14th December 2017.
- x. **Motivation for Blood Donation (05/04/18):** The aim of the program was to spread awareness about blood donation and motivate people to donate blood. The activity consisted of a preliminary questionnaire which gave an account of the current status of frequency of the people donating blood. People were explained about the benefits of blood donation and motivated to donate blood in future.

- xi. **Kitchen Waste Management and Compost (07/04/18):** The aim of the program was to spread awareness about segregation and composting of kitchen waste from households. The activity consisted of a preliminary questionnaire which gave an account of the current waste management status in the households. Brief step wise protocol for easy composting at home was explained to the members of the family by the students.
- xii. **Vitamin D Deficiency (09/04/18):** The aim was to spread awareness about the vitamin D deficiency, its causes and consequences. Deficiency of vitamin D can lead to serious health issues and therefore to make people aware about the vitamin D deficiency, its causes and consequence, this activity was undertaken. Handout on food items and source of vitamin D was given to each house.
- xiii. **Nutrition Requirement of Children (10/04/18):** The aim was to explain the dietary intake essential for the proper physical and mental growth of children. A worksheet was prepared to collect data on the amount of protein, carbohydrate, fats, vitamins and mineral intake of the child. The families were explained about the nutritional requirements of children. Chart of nutrition requirement according to age was given to each house.
- xiv. **Sanitary Hygiene (13/04/18):** The program aimed to create awareness about the importance sanitary hygiene. A questionnaire was prepared and put forth to the women with an aim to understand the present scenario of the sanitary hygiene. The women were explained about care and hygienic practices during menstruation.
- xv. **Garbage Segregation (13/04/18):** The program aimed to create awareness about the importance garbage disposal and segregation. Methods of disposal of organic and inorganic wastes were explained.
- xvi. **Importance of Immunization (14/04/18):** The community outreach activity aimed to collect information regarding the vaccines taken by children and to provide information with respect to importance of immunization. The students explained the parents the consequences of not receiving a vaccine and the long term complications associated. The checklist of the immunization chart was also provided.

Relevance of Butterfly garden in ensuring clean environment are multiple.

Besides being pollinators of many plants, they also serve as important part of the food chain. The most important feature is that Butterflies serve as an 'Ecosystem barometer' which tells us about the health of our environment. These creatures are sensitive to changes in climate, the presence of harmful chemicals, pollution in the air and water, and any other changes in the environment. Presence of many species of butterflies on our campus is an indication that the Chowgule college campus is clean and healthy.

- vi. The department of Zoology also installed 'Bird houses' on the campus on 13th Feb 2018. This was an initiative to promote faunal diversity on campus and sensitise students towards conservation and protection of biodiversity.

ANNEXURE XVI

CHOWGULE CENTRE FOR TEACHING and LEARNING (CTL)

INTRODUCTION/NEED:

Use of Information Communication Technology (ICT) in enhancing the quality of education is something that almost everyone is interested in, these days. Concepts like open content, open data, and open resources, along with notions of transparency and easy access to data and information is becoming a value. Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) are being widely explored as alternatives and supplements to traditional university courses. The workforce demands skills from college graduates that are more often acquired from informal learning experiences than in universities. Education paradigms are shifting to include online learning, hybrid learning, and collaborative models. At the same time, the teaching paradigms across all sectors too, besides including the above, demand much more teamwork and collaboration. As the abundance of resources and relationships made easily accessible via the Internet grows, we are ever more challenged to revisit our roles as educators.

Faculty training still does not acknowledge the fact that digital media literacy continues its rise in importance as a key skill in every discipline and profession. The demand for personalized learning is not adequately supported by current technology or practices on campus. Economic pressures and new models of education are bringing unprecedented competition to the traditional models of higher education. The emergence of new scholarly forms of authoring, publishing, and researching, outpace sufficient and scalable modes of assessment. Many challenges impacting technology uptake are grounded in everyday realities that often make it difficult to learn about, much less adopt, new tools and approaches.

A number of workshops, seminars and training programs in this area are being held regularly. There are also many conferences and publications in this area. However, still the adoption and effective utilization of technology in education is low. One of the contributing factors is the lack of awareness at the level of teachers and institutions, and perhaps the lack of access to usable resources and inadequate sharing of experiences among those working in this field. A centre like this will help address this gap, by offering useful inputs and allowing for sharing of experiences with the relevant community.

The infrastructure for the centre has been partly funded by RUSA (Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan)

OBJECTIVES

The main objective of setting up of the Centre for Teaching and Learning (CTL) is to:

1. Educate faculty on how to go about integrating ICT in Higher Education effectively by conducting workshops, seminars and provide them with hands-on experience/training.

2. Develop E-content for the various courses offered by the college and other educational institutions.
3. Innovate, Implement and Share different ICT tools in teaching like Simulation, Gamification, LMS, Mobile Applications, etc.
4. Conduct Research related to use of ICT, Learning Analytics, Mobiles, LMS, etc.
5. Provide Consultancy services to schools and other Higher Educational Institutions by providing a roadmap for ICT implementation
6. Provide Assessment/evaluation strategies to track student progression to graduation.

PLAN OF ACTION AND EXPECTED OUTCOMES

Setting up of a lab with networked Computers, Printer cum scanner and Lap tops. The lab would use proprietary as well as open source software to generate e-content. There will also be another Audio-Visual Room where faculty and students can record lectures, stream lectures live and also perform role plays.

In the initial years (first two), the center will cater to train the trainers by conducting training programmes on use of ICT in education, and also initiate research and consultancy on ICT usage and various teaching learning methodologies and curriculum design. The following year developing e-content in various subjects offered in various subjects. And subsequently offer online programmes.

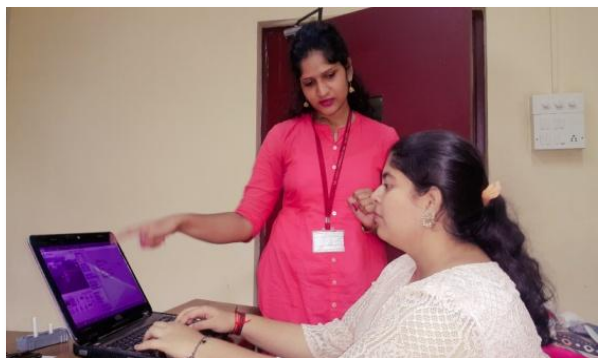

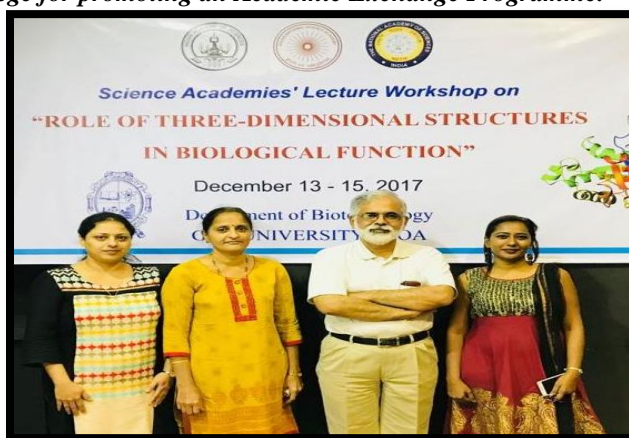

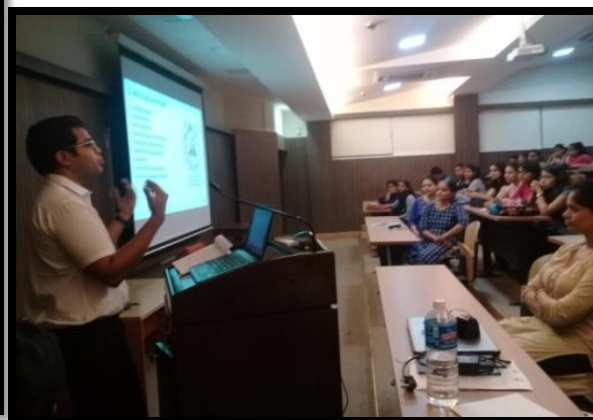
