REPORT OF THE STUDENTS SATISFACTION SURVEY FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2020-2021

1. INTRODUCTION:

Parvatibai Chowgule College of Arts and Sciences (Autonomous), Margao, Goa conducted the Students Satisfaction Survey between Aug 1, 2021 to Aug 10, 2021. For a survey of this nature and scope, a record number of 452 students across various programmes run by the College participated in the survey.

1.1 OBJECTIVE:

The objective of the survey was to evaluate students' satisfaction level toward the Teaching Learning Process and other services facilitated at the college. The survey was conducted following the guidelines of the NAAC.

As the global pandemic has continued for the entire academic year resulting in largely online or blended mode of teaching and evaluation, few questions were also included to assess the awareness of online repositories, effectiveness of online teaching and evaluation, and issues faced by students in connection to these.

1.2 SURVEY METHODOLOGY:

Multiple choice-based questions were categorized into four major areas for assessments.

- A. Assessment of Teaching Learning Process
- B. Assessment of Evaluation Process
- C. Assessment of mechanisms in place for overall growth of students
- D. Awareness of various knowledge portals and effectiveness of online teaching and evaluation

A total of 25 questions were divided among above four categories. Two of the questions also collected students' subjective assessment and suggestions to improve the TLP and other facilitating services of the College.

2.2 ASSESSMENT OF THE TEACHING LEARING PROCESS




Figure 1: The Relevance of the Syllabus




Figure 2: Teachers Communicate the Course Objectives, Course Outcomes and Programme Outcomes

Apart from selecting and grooming well qualified faculty on continuous basis, Parvatibai Chowgule College also emphasizes outcome-based learning. Every year the curriculum is reexamined and revised by academic as well as industry experts. Especially from Academic Year 2020-2021, workshops were conducted by the College for the teaching faculty to emphasize attainment of Course Outcomes (COs) leading up to attainment of Programme Outcomes (POs). In many cases COs were redesigned based on Bloom's Taxonomy and Learning Pyramid for the teaching learning to take place at higher levels. Faculty members taking various subject submitted CO reports based on the Continuous Assessment (CAs) and End Semester Examination. These efforts have been very positively reflected in the survey. Nearly all students (98.7%) have shown confidence in the relevance of the syllabus (Figure 1). 90.7% students also affirmed that they were made aware of the course objectives, Course Outcomes (COs), and Programme Outcomes by the faculty on a regular basis (Figure 2).

Ability to transfer of knowledge from a faculty to a student is an art that can be imparted and also a gift that is inborn. Knowledge transfer resulting in effective teaching learning has become especially challenging since the ongoing global pandemic. At the beginning of the semester faculty members conduct competency tests to gain insight into students' then understanding level and fulfillment of pre-requisites. Bases on students' competency, bridge courses or topics are discussed in groups or even at individual level so that the entire class can be at the same level of understanding. This process is repeated during the semester if necessary.




Figure 3: Effectiveness of Teachers to Communicate






Figure 4: Preparation Level of Teachers for Classes




Figure 5: Effective Illustrations of Concepts




Figure 7: Understanding of students' learning needs






Figure 6: Student Centric Methods

Faculty of the College have made extra efforts to overcome the challenges of online teaching and evaluation. The survey shows that in 92.3% cases teachers have communicate effectively with the students (Figure 3). 98% students have expressed that the faculty come well prepared (Figure 4) and 89.9% students said that efforts were made to explain concepts through relevant examples etc (Figure 5). The survey also reflects that in 90% times teachers understood students specific learning needs through competency tests etc (Figure 7). Keeping students engaged and interested in the subject and its discussion requires a variety of pedagogy. 89% of the participants have expressed that teacher have used students' centric methods like Experiential Learning, Participative Learning, Flipped Classroom etc to enrich the learning experience in spite of the challenges posed by online classes (Figure 6).

2.3 ASSESSMENT OF EVALUATION PROCESS




Figure 8: Fairness of Evaluation






Figure 9: Marks shown to students




Figure 10: Relation between lectures and the tests conducted

The College has a policy of conducting several Continuous Assessments (CA) and one final End Semester Examination (ESE). As a matter of policy each of the CA is conducted in different modes such as: written test, MCQ based quiz, assignments, projects, viva, research writing and presentation etc. Also each CA is designed to target a subset of the Course Outcomes for that particular subject and so also an appropriate assessment mode for those sets of COs is decided by the teacher and made known to the students at the beginning of semester or with sufficient time in advance. Evaluation is done on a timely bases and the marks obtained by the students are shared with them for feedback and further discussion. 87% of respondents have recorded that the assessment done were fair (Figure 8). Nearly 85% responded have recorded that the marks obtained by them were shared with them by the concerned faculty (Figure 9). 95% of respondents have expressed satisfaction over the variety of assessment mode adopted by the faculty. Nearly 90% respondents think that the assessment made were a good test of what was taught during the interactions (Figure 10)

2.4 ASSESSMENT OF MECHANISMS IN PLACE FOR OVERALL GROWTH OF STUDENTS

The objective of modern higher education is not just imparting subject knowledge but also to prepare students to be ready for jobs, career, higher studies etc which require a variety of other essential skills beside subject knowledge. The Teaching Learning and Evaluation Process of the College is consciously designed to impart other skills besides subject knowledge. These interventions are usually in the form of Mentoring, Academic Support, Internship, Students Exchange, Placement Assistant, Activities like Field Trip, Industrial Tour, Excursions etc. Also, various events and Clubs at College and Department level are meant to develop students overall personality. The online mode and shutdowns have especially challenged such activities which are otherwise regular activities of the College experience. But the College has done reasonably good even in these areas in the midst of great challenges because of the active interest taken by the College and its teachers toward promoting these activities.




Figure 11: Relation between Multiple Mode of Evaluation and Generic skill gained






Figure 12: Academic Support and Assistance




Figure 13: Promotion of Internships etc




Figure 14: Opportunities for Personality Development






Figure 15: Efforts made toward development of Soft Skills etc




Figure 16: Effectiveness of Mentoring




Figure 17: Regularity of Mentor-Mentee meeting




Figure 18: Collection of Students' Feedback

84% of respondents believe that multiple mode of evaluation has helped them gain generic skills such as problem-solving, team work, ability to plan, confidence to learn, positivity and exposure to new opportunities etc (Figure 11). 84% of respondents have expressed that Academic Support, Activities and Assistance provided by teachers helped improve the Teaching-Learning Process (Figure 12). 64% participants have affirmed that College / Teachers have either often or regularly taken active interest in promoting Internships, Students Exchange and Field Opportunities (Figure 13). 71% participants agree that enough opportunities were provided to students to develop personality through activities, events, clubs etc (Figure 14). 75% participants express satisfaction about the efforts made to inculcate Soft Skills, Life Skills, Employability Skills etc (Figure 15). 46% participants believe that Teaching and Mentoring process facilitated their Cognitive, Social and Emotional growth (Figure 16). 40% respondents have stated that their mentors had meetings with them usualy or always (Figure 17). 86% students agree that feedback of the courses were collected from students to help improve the Teaching Learning Process of the College (Figure 18). 82% of participants agree or strongly agree that the overall quality of Teaching-Learning Process of the collge is very good (Figure 19).

2.5 ASSESSMENT OF EFFECTIVENES OF ONLINE TEACHING AND EVALUATION

Recording online classes and sharing the video lectures have become the new norm during the lockdowns. This has helped students revisit the lecture and gain better understanding. Also, students who would miss any lecture for whatever reason gets an opportunity to catch up with what was taught by watching the recorded lectures. Faculty members made efforts to make recorded lectures available to the students. Even assessments in the viva-voice and presentation mode were recorded so students can get appropriate feedback. The shutdowns and online classes opened door and drew attention toward well prepared materials available on various knowledge portals such as SWAYAM/NPTEL, DISTAVO, edX, Coursera etc. to be accessed by the students to enrich and supplement the learning. Keeping in mind few questions were added to the survey to assess the effectiveness of online teaching and evaluation.




Figure 20: Preferred Online Method






Figure 21: Effectiveness of Counseling during Lock-down




Figure 22: Awareness and access of knowledge portals

54% respondents appreciated the online lectures through Google Meet, Zoometc while another 23% respondents appreciated availability of pre-recorded lectures and regular contacts through WhatsApp, Google Classroom etc (Figure 20). 49% respondent expressed that counselling provided specifically during lockdown was usually or always consistent and helpful (Figure 21). 69% participants were either aware of or accessed SWAYAM/NPTEL, while 23% participants expressed awareness or accessed the Coursera knowledge portals during lock-downs (Figure 22).




Figure 23: Over quality of Teaching-Learning Process
