


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#### Report of "National Road Safety Week 2020: A poster competition"





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# Report on "Online Workshop on "Swachhta Action Plan" an initiative by Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education"

Dr.Sonal Sawant was the speaker for the first session. She gave a very informative lecture on the topic "Hair and its types, Ayurvedic management of hairfall, dandruff and premature graying" explaining the structure of hair, pigments and proteins of hair, types of hair (straight, curly , wavy etc). diet and nutrition required to maintain hair fall and dandruff, common causes for hairfall , dandruff and premature greying. The lecture was followed by demonstration of hair oils, shampoos and hair packs.

The second session was conducted by Dr.RashmilaChindarkar. The topic for her lecture was "Concept of Skin, skin types and metabolism. Ayurvedic guidelines about diet and nutrition for healthy skin". Dr Chindarkar explained about the the layers of the skin, types of skin like kapha, pitta and vata and enlightened the participants on how to maintain the skin and which products they can choose depending on the type of skin. The lecture was followed by demonstration where Dr.Rashmilas conducted small activity with the help of a simple questionnaire. # Benaulim commences work on draft CZMP

NT NETWORK Benaulim

The villagers of Benaulim along with the panchayat body and village committees have began working on drafting a fresh Coastal Zone Management Plan (CZMP).

A meeting was held on Friday to collect inputs from the locals.

The meeting saw stakeholders interacting with resource persons for listing their area-specific suggestions.

The stakeholders, including fishermen, farmers, shack operators, water sport operators and dairy farmers submitted their suggestions to the resource persons Abhijeet Prabhudessai, Venzy Viegas and a local Rudolf Baretto.

Viegas gathered all the suggestions, with the help of students from Chowgule college, and will do the groundwork and draft a new map. The map will be

first approved by a special gram sabha and then sent to the environment department.

Starting from the south boundary of the village, a list is being prepared of the houses; in the earlier plan, high tide line (HTL) was found to extend into ponds and paddy fields; boundaries of fishing wards were shown outside the Coastal Regulatory Zone (CRZ)

During the meeting, the locals urged for marking the entire beach stretch as a fishing ward as fishing activities including fish drying, and 'parking' of boats are being carried out there.

Emphasis was also laid on correctly marking fields that are near the coast on the map.

"Sand dunes on the beach have to be marked correctly as it is the first defence in case of water rise. A unique feature of our village is the presence of fields that run parallel to the coast. This acts a reservoir in case the water level rises and breaks the sand dunes. These fields will help hold water in the case of flooding, and should, therefore be shown in the CZMP," said a local and former sarpanch Agnelo Fernandes.

With the first step of data collection completed, the villagers will now conduct ground-level checks with the help of Chowgule college students and draft a new plan that is expected to be presented during the special gram sabha that would held on August 29.

Taking no chances after the fiasco by the Chennai-based NCSCM, Saxttikars seemed to have employed all mediums to draft the Coastal Zone Management Plan for their villages – right from motorised boats to drones, students and experts.

If the fishing communities inhabiting the banks of River Sal, along the Ambelim, Assolna Velim belt employed country-made motorised canoes to map the fishing activities in the river Sal, Varca village employed the drones to carry out the survey along the coastal belt in a bid to obtain the features on the ground. Other coastal villages, including Colva and Benaulim have used the expertise of the Citizens of Coastal Communities as well as Geology students of Chowgule College to ensure that the ground reality finds

Says former Varca Sarpanch, Roland Fernandes: "The Varca panchayat roped in an agency to carry out the drone survey of the coastal areas of the village so that all the features are mapped properly on the draft-plan. We expect the agency to submit the plan prepared by the drone in a day or two, after which the villagers will give approval for the CZMP before it is forwarded to the government for approval".

Traditional fishermen inhabit-ing the banks of river Sal in the riverine villages of Velim, Am-belim and Assolna are on a different mission. Equipped with a motorised cance, the fisher men along with students and experts moved around in the river, taking them right from Cutbona in Velim to Deussua in Chinchinim, And, the objective behind the boat ride is not for fishing as may appear, but to map the fishing spots in the river as well as sluice gates be-fore they are all incorporated in the Coastal Zone Management Plan (CZMP).

Plan (CZMP).

The river Sal is the home for rich species of shell fish, including kalva, tisreos, shinaneos and kube, besides river fish such as the much-sought after shevtte and mordoshe. If the Ambelim-Bandar area is the home for kalvas, the area around Zug Mobor is famous for shenaneos. While the river course around the Betul jetty area is known for muchsought after tisreos and kubes, stakes erections along the river course from Velim to the Deussua-Orlim bridge point helps the traditional fishermen to net river fish, making Sal the big-gest river fishing belt. Sadly, the fishing points in the river Sal and the fishing ar-

eas in these villages found no

### Benaulikars set in motion process to prepare draft plan

MARGAO: Benaulikars on Friday set in motion the process to prepare a draft Coastal Zone Management Plan (CZMP) for the village by involving various stakeholders, including the traditional fishermen, farmers, fishing communities, toddy tappers, beach shack owners and the villagers

With the help of the coastal communities rep resented by activists Abhijit Prabhudesai and Wenzy Viegas, the villagers went about the job of showing the sluice gates (mush), the fishermen's huts and communities, the community

canoe and fishing boat ramps, etc. They also showed the location of the traditional fishing activities, aqua culture (manshios), be-sides sand dunes, paddy fields spread across the village. Water bodies, including the traditional gayres, which found no mention in the draftplan, will be shown in the draft village plan. A villager Rudolf Barretto informed that beginning from Saturday, the team consisting of the stakeholders and the students of Chowgule College, Margao will undertake a field trip of the village for three days to the ground reality. "After gathering all the inputs from the stakeholders as well as from the field trip to the nook and corner of the village, a report will

be compiled which will then be placed before the special gram sabha to be conveyed next week." Rudolf said.

At the last meeting of the villagers held in July, Benaulim villagers carried out a thorough review of the proposed CZMP for the village prepared by NCSCM. It is found that the proposed plan prepared by NCSCM has failed to demarcate important coastal features both natural and manmade. It is noted that the location of high tide line has been wrongly extended into aquacul-ture ponds and paddy fields. The fishing wards have been shown outside the CRZ area.

# Loutolim, Chinchinim reject draft CZMPs

Slam govt for effecting 'no changes' despite sending their suggestions

MARGAO: Rejecting the draft Coastal Zone Management Plans (CZMP) sent by the government, Loutolim and Chinchinim Deussua villagers on Sunday slammed the government for effecting "no changes" in the draft despite sending their suggestions.

The locals at the Loutolim gram sabha, which was attended by around 170 villagers, claimed that the present draft sent to them has the earlier pages shown on one page.

Explaining the plan sent by the government, Village Development Committee chairman Ramiro Mascarenhas said the second plan showed the ground reality based on Google Maps,

### 'GARAM' SABHAS

- Point out to some discrepancies and decide to invite suggestions till October 4
- Show 20 sluice gates which the government failed to

- Stress the need to protect houses at Rassaim, which are practically on the river bank
- Ask panchayat to write to the CoP not to issue anymore permissions to use riverine land
- Sarpanch assures the people that the plan would be kept open for public scrutiny till Oct 4 in the panchayat hall and the map would be explained to the people

AT CHINCHINIM: Villagers furious over the govt's failure to depute a person to explain to them the plan

- Claim that there were no changes in the plan except what was earlier shown in four pages has now been presented on one page
- No sluice gates have been shown in the plan submitted by the govt as the villagers' plan prepared with the help of Chowgule College students shows six sluice gates and all water bodies

which had all details marked including the names of Kator or the fishing areas, names of khazans and sluice gates. Finally, a third map was shown which would be sent to the government. When the villagers pointed out to some discrepancies it was decided to invite suggestions till October 4 following which the plan would be sent to the government.

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### COMMUNITY OUTREACH ACTIVITIES BY DEPARTMENT OF ZOOLOGY (2019-2020)

**Community Outreach activities By Department of Zoology**: As part of social responsibility, the TYBSc students carry out community outreach activities every year since 2017, under the guidance of all the faculty members of the department. 11 community outreach activities were carried out by 55 students of department of Zoology.

1) Awareness on the various SC/ST schemes: The Community Outreach Activity to

create awareness on the various SC/ST schemes was held from 17th to 20th December 2019 in Davorlim village. Total of 40 houses from Davorlim village were considered for the programme. The main aim of this activity was to spread awareness regarding the various SC/ST schemes provided by the government and its benefits. The students informed about the eligibility criteria and also the necessary documents essential to apply for the schemes and the contact person for the schemes. The students provided information regarding various schemes viz. Housing scheme, Saral Vidya Scheme, meritorious scholarship scheme, Kanya Dhan Scheme and others. Soft copy of the schemes was also shared with the community.





2) Beach cleaning and awareness on importance of marine life: The community outreach programme was carried out at Varca Beach, Majorda Beach and Utorda Beach. It involved interaction with the local community of these coastal areas, tourists and shack owners. A questionnaire was administered to know their level of awareness of beach pollution and its consequences. About 50 people answered the questionnaire survey, giving out their opinions and suggestions on maintaining the cleanliness of the sea shore. The students also carried out beach cleaning activities. The main aim of this was to highlight the importance of cleanliness of the beaches and the need to maintain it.







3) Awareness on the plastic pollution: As a part of the community outreach activity, an awareness drive on plastic pollution was carried out on 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> December 2019 in Gogol. The main aim of this activity was to create awareness regarding the plastic pollution and its effects on the environment. A short questionnaire was prepared to understand the public opinion on plastic pollution. The students surveyed a total of 50 houses, hotels, cafes, cake



shops, and liquor shop. The students explained the harmful effects of plastic to the animals and environment. They also suggested alternatives of saying no to plastic straw and using environment friendly material instead of plastic.

4) Highlight the importance of physical fitness: The community outreach activity on awareness on importance of Physical fitness/exercise was carried out from 17<sup>th</sup>-20<sup>th</sup> December 2019 in Gogol, Margao. The students surveyed a total of 110 individuals with the help of a questionnaire. It was observed that 70% of the individuals were not aware of dietary causes of "obesity" and its association with lack of physical activity. The students explained the



importance of maintaining a healthy diet and including some form of physical activity such as walking and jogging in their daily routine.

As a part of the community outreach activity, awareness on the importance of personal hygiene and ringworm infection was carried out from 17th-20th December 2019 in Gogol, Margao. The students surveyed a total of 109 individuals with the help of a questionnaire. 10% of the people interviewed had contacted ringworm infection earlier. The students also informed about ringworm infection and how it can be avoided and controlled.



- 6) Awareness on Malaria and Dengue: The community outreach was conducted in two localities near Chowgule College, namely Housing board and Agalli, from the 21st to the 23rd of December, 2019. The students surveyed a total of 20 houses. 20% of the people surveyed had family members who had suffered from either malaria or Dengue. The students informed that the diseases were curable, but if not intervened can lead to the death of the individual. The symptoms of the diseases and need for seeking medical help if these symptoms are seen was conveyed to the community. People were informed about the causes, diagnosis and treatment of these diseases Preventive measures for the same were also explained.
- 7) Motivation campaign for blood donation: The community outreach was conducted
  - in two localities in Housing board and Agalli, from the 21st to the 23rd of December, 2019. Altogether 80 houses were surveyed and made aware about blood donations and its importance as social virtue. The main objective of the program was to motivate people to donate blood. They were informed about how blood donations would save many lives. They also explained about the different blood donation services.



- 8) Road safety awareness: was held on 17th and 18th December 2019 in Arlem and Curtorim. The students prepared a questionnaire regarding road safety and traffic laws. A chart containing all traffic signals was also shown to every household, in order to make them familiar. A total of 25 houses were covered, most of them being apartments in a complex. Most of the people had some strong opinions about traffic laws and fines. According to about 80% of the people interviewed, the increase in traffic fines was justified, as they thought it is a stronger way to implement traffic rules. At the same time about 90% of the people felt that proper road and maintenance are directly proportional to road safety.
- 9) Preventing Malnutrition: A community outreach programme was conducted on 18th
  - December 2019 to create awareness on "Importance on Having a Healthy Diet". Total of 17 houses were surveyed. A Performa was prepared to obtain information about the food habits, food allergies etc. A chart on healthy diet as approved by WHO was provided to the people, especially to make them understand the dietary requirements of children, adults and elderly.



10) *Importance on Sleep*: This community outreach programme was conducted from 16<sup>th</sup> -18<sup>th</sup> December 2019. Total of 31 individuals were surveyed. A questionnaire was prepared to obtain information on individuals' sleeping pattern, duration of sleep etc. 41% of the individuals had a problem of disturbed sleep but did not show any symptoms of



insomnia. Students and the working individuals were explained about the importance of sleep and its effects on their health and ill effect of induced sleep using sleeping pills.

11) Organic Farming: The community outreach activity was conducted on organic

farming from 13<sup>th</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> January in Borda. The local community was informed about simple stratergies of adopting organic farming at their homes. They were informed about concept of bioaccumulation and biomagnifications and leaching of chemical fertilizers into the surrounding water bodies.

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

A total of 17 student participants were accompanied by two faculty members (Mr. Stephen Jonah Dias; Dr. Nandini Vaz Fernandes), who explained about birding and bird spotting during the walk. The Maina-Curtorim-Wetland Complex is a bio-diversity rich ecoregion nestled in-between human habitation. Primary habitat types that can be found in this complex are Manmade irrigation tank, paddy cultivation land, mangroves and woodland habitats. An upward of 150 species of birds has been recorded in this area. A total of 38 species of birds were recorded in the area during the birdwalk.



# Summary of the proceedings

The project comprised of two parts, the first part included the installation of solar panels on the rooftop of building block D to utilise solar energy to empower electrical gadgets on the first floor of D-block. The second part of the project included the illumination of road from college main gate to college office using solar street lights.

1. **Installation of solar panels:** The process involved the identification of a suitable shadow-free space on the roof top of D-block. Nine solar panels of each with maximum power of 330 watts were procured. Thus total maximum power that could be generated is 2.97 kilowatts. The metallic frames were fabricated and fixed on the terrace on which the solar panels were installed. The inverter is installed on the adjacent wall near the roof-top which is used to convert DC voltage output to an AC voltage. The inverter output was wired to different installations by electrical cables. The load is distributed as follows:


The average life of Solar PV system is 15 – 20 years.

### 2. Installation of solar street lights:

Objective is to illuminate the road from college main gate to gymnasium. For proper illumination, we proposed to install the solar powered LED lights at every 10 meters. Accordingly six poles were erected from college main gate to college office. Solar street light works on the principle of solar cells. Solar cell absorb solar energy during the day. The solar cell then converts the solar energy into electrical energy which is stored in the battery. During night time street light starts automatically and consumes energy already stored in the battery. Solar street lights are composed of LED lights. LED lights are used since it works on small currents and hence smaller sized solar panels suffice the solar street lights with LEDs. These LEDs work on directly on DC current and hence there is no additional requirement of DC to AC converter unit.

Units composed of solar panels and LED bulbs were procured and assembled. Each unit is also fixed with motion sensors. During the night time if there is a motion near the solar street light as detected by the motion sensor and all LEDs glow 100%. If there is no motion only 33% of LEDs glow resulting in higher backups and energy savings. For effective functioning of the solar street lights, an array of LEDs bulb of 60 Watts giving light intensity of 30 to 40 lux in the vicinity of the electricity pole are installed.


