

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

Summary of the proceedings	<ul> <li>Dr. Baban Ingole is the Chief Scientist, Prof. and Head of Biological</li> <li>Oceanography Division of National Institute of Oceanography (NIO). He delivered a lecture on biofouling and its impact on the marine ecosystem. Dr. Anand Jain is a Project Scientist at National Centre for Antarctic and Ocean Research (NCAOR) headland, Sada, Vasco. He enlightened the students on the microbiology of Kongsfjorden Arctic and future prospects of research in the field.</li> <li>Biofouling of industrial water systems is a problem of considerable technoeconomic significance. Biofouling is described as undesirable deposition of micro- and macroorganisms on industrial cooling equipment, resulting in operational failures such as clogging of water flow in the cooling water conduits and condenser tubes; reducing heat transfer efficiency, and accelerating pipeline corrosion. To understand the phenomenon of biofouling, it is required to know about microbial biofilm development and in succession of macrofoulants settlement. The antifouling measures adopted to control biofouling depend on the type of cooling system and fouling organisms. In this chapter the author describes briefly the types of cooling systems, elaborates the steps in biofilm formation, defines biofouling, highlights the fouling problems in a coastal power plant, and finally describes the use of chlorine in biofouling control.</li> </ul>

- 3. Bird walk for Swedish Delegates: CBC

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




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Title:	Trip to Fish Processing Industry for T.Y.B.Sc students

Objective:	To acquaint the students with the process of fish preservation and packaging.
Summary of the proceedings	The students were shown various processes involved in fish processing and preservation like preparation of raw materials needed for processing and packaging of the final product in a sanitary and hygienic environment. Quality Exporters processes and exports fish. Quality Exports uses different types of refrigerators and containers to store and process fish at different temperatures. The main purpose of the field trip was to expose the students to the various techniques of fish preservation, processing and export. Quality Exports is a fish processing plant owned and managed by Mr. Ibrahim Maulana. It exports a wide variety of fish such as mackerel, ribbon fish, kingfish, shrimp, cuttle fish, squids and other types of sea food to countries such as China and other parts of South East Asia. An employee of the company explained that the first step in fish processing is to preserve the fish as soon as possible in order to maintain its nutritional value, consumption quality and shelf life. Quality Exports uses the refrigeration and freezing technique of preserving
	fish. Students were acquainted with the area where the fish is first washed, segregated into cartons by weight and then stored in freezers. Several employees organized into assembly lines carry out this process in a hygienic manner.
	In order to prevent the fish from losing its freshness, it is stored in freezers having temperatures set to -180C and -400C. Students were also given a






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


	<ul> <li>Butterflies (and moths to a lesser extent) are an extremely important group of 'model' organisms used, for centuries, to investigate many areas of biological research, including such diverse fields as navigation, pest control, embryology, mimicry, evolution, genetics, population dynamics and biodiversity conservation.</li> <li>The long history and popularity of butterfly study have provided a unique data resource on an insect group unmatched in geographical scale and timescale anywhere in the world. This has proved extremely important for scientific research on climate change.</li> <li>Butterflies and moths are indicators of a healthy environment and healthy ecosystems.</li> <li>They indicate a wide range of other invertebrates, which comprise over two-thirds of all species.</li> <li>Areas rich in butterflies and moths are rich in other invertebrates. These collectively provide a wide range of environmental benefits, including pollination and natural pest control.</li> <li>Moths and butterflies are an important element of the food chain and are prey for birds, bats and other insectivorous animals (for example, in Britain and Ireland, Blue Tits eat an estimated 50 billion moth caterpillars each year).</li> <li>Butterflies have been widely used by ecologists as model organisms to study the impact of habitat loss and fragmentation, and climate change.</li> </ul>
