





Objective:	To highlight the various career opportunities available to the students of geology and the preparation required to peruse a career in Geology and also to highlight the various avenues for recruitment of geologist in India
Summary of the proceedings	A Student-expert cum alumni interaction session was organised by the Department of Geology - Parvatibai Chowgule College of Arts and Science Autonomous on 23 rd July 2019, to enlighten the budding undergraduate students with the avenues available in the field of Geology. The interaction was between the students and Akshay Kelkar who is currently a Trainee Scientific Officer at the Atomic Mineral Division in Hyderabad.
	All students were very excited to meet Sir Akshay and grab this unique opportunity to enhance their awareness in the fields available after graduation. The third year Geology students of the Bachelors course were more enthusiastic as they experienced great memories under Sir Akshay's tutelage in the year 2017-2018, when he was the assistant professor in the Geology Department. The event began with Alistair Souza (student of Third Year) introducing the Guest speaker and mentioning his achievements. Later Sir Harish Nadkarni motivated the bright students with a great speech telling us about outlook that we students should have to achieve a successful future. Sir Akshay began his interaction with the experiences he had through his young career. His career is like a rose which has thorns in the beginning and the rose petals at the top. The thorns are the struggles and hard work he had in the beginning of his career and the

rose petals symbolises the success he has currently achieved by getting an opportunity as a Trainee Scientific Officer at AMD. The success is not complete as he has a long path to follow. This success was achievable all because of his persistence, guidance from the Geology Department Faculty and the support and prayers from his close and dear ones. Sir Akshay mentioned the various universities available in India for the Master's study. This included the State Universities, Central Universities and the reputed Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) and National Institute Technology (NIT). Some of the state universities include the Osmania University, Annamalai University, Ferguson University, Saint Xavier's University and Goa University where he pursued his Master's Degree in Applied Geology. The central universities are Central University of Kerala, Pondicherry University, Central University of Karnataka, Delhi University and Banaras Hindu University which Sir Akshay joined for his PhD. Sir told us about the criteria to join these universities. We received valuable information regarding the JAM Exam which is required to pursue Master's IIT and NIT. As for the fields available to study in the Master's programme, Sir Akshay provided information on Applied Geology, Geoinformatics, Petroleum Geology, Environmental Geology, Marine Science, Climatology and considering the current water crises, the important field of Groundwater and Geophysics which can be used to study the deep portions of the Earth. We were enlightened about the CSIR-UGC NET exam whose certificate has a two year validity for being a Lecturer and a Junior Research Fellow (JRF) after MSc. The certificate for JRF is also allowed after BSc. The students were updated about the recruiters for geologists like the Indian School of Mines, FUGRO, Vedanta etc. for Mining and Geophysical opportunities, SHELL, ONGC for Petroleum Geologists, ISRO, GSI, Central Groundwater Board and DAE-BRNS => AMD are some of the government organisational recruiters. Recruitment in AMD requires clearing the BARC exam and an interview thereafter. The interaction with Sir Akshay was an 'Eye Opener' and made us realise the truth that the future is not a 'cakewalk' and we need to be hardworking and persistent. We gained knowledge about the vast scopes available after graduation and the steps and measures required to achieve the field of our interest. The students are very grateful to the faculty members of the Geology Department for arranging this informative and fruitful session and to Sir Akshay for being so kind in spending his valuable time to enlighten us. 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

Career Talk by Ms. Sangrail Brito Carvalho and Ms. KimberlyPereira 2019-20

The Department of Psychology, Parvatibai Chowgule College of Arts and Science (Autonomous) has taken up the initiative of starting a series of talks titled "Career Talks" for the students of the department. Owing to the current situation, the talks were held online and Google meet was used as a medium for the same. Speakers working in different fields of psychology deliver a talk to students on their journey and experiences to guide the students on their career paths and introduce them to new opportunities and challenges in the practical world out there. They also help clear the possible confusions and misconceptions the students might have, and help them gain greater clarity for their career plans ahead.

This series kick-started on 28th April 2020 with the first talk delivered by Ms Sangrail Brito Carvalho. She is an alumnus of the college and the department, who is now working in the field of Corporate Psychology as a 'Training Coordinator' at KNOLKSKAPE Solutions, Bangalore. The talk was arranged on the online platform of 'Google Meet' so all students could join the talk and

interact with the speaker right from their homes. Ms Carvalho began by introducing herself and then introduced the students to the field of Corporate Psychology. She went on to talk about the different careers and branching careers in Corporate Psychology and what each one entails. This was a new career avenue for many students and hence the students shared that the explanation given by the speaker was very enlightening and informative for them. Sangrail then spoke of her journey right from when she finished her undergraduate degree to how she ended up where she is today. She spoke of what she learned along the way and the pros and cons of being in this field. She then addressed all the questions and doubts that the students had about the topic. She also gave the students a few tips, like pursuing different skills and other courses even after having established a career, as continually growing and enhancing yourself in your field of expertise is essential in this competitive world.

The second talk of the series was organised on April 29th 2020. The speaker for this session was Ms. Kimberly Pereira a former student at Parvatibai Chowgule College of Arts and Science, Autonomous. Faculty member, Asst professor Dr. Golda Vas welcomed every one and also introduced the speaker. In her introduction she informed everyone that after completing her bachelors degree at SPCC Ms. Pereira went on to complete her Masters in psychology. She has also completed numerous short-term courses in different fields of psychology. The resource person Miss Pereira, took the students through her life's journey. She spoke about how she was a sensitive person and many people around her exclaimed saying that she was not cut out for studies of psychology and to be a psychologist. However, through many years of self-doubt she finally found her fulfilment as a counsellor at Don Bosco school at Navi Mumbai and presently heads the department. She emphasized that as psychologist one is expected to be a superhuman but that is not quite possible as one tends to have one's limitation. She said the only difference between the counsellor and a client in this regard is that the counsellor has the knowledge of

what s/he is going through which is not the same with the client. She focused on many options available

which the students may explore and have a fulfilling career in the field of psychology. After her sharing, the students clarified their doubts with Ms. Pereira. There were around 35 participants including students and faculty members in attendance for this career guidance talk. Asst professor Mr. Aresh Naik proposed the vote of thanks. 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




Figure 4: Stills from the Biotechnology alumni meet.

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



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

Quality Exports uses different types of refrigerators and containers to store and process fish at different temperatures. The main purpose of the field trip was to expose the students to the various techniques of fish preservation, processing and export. Quality Exports is a fish processing plant owned and managed by Mr. Ibrahim Maulana. It exports a wide variety of fish such as mackerel, ribbon fish, kingfish, shrimp, cuttle fish, squids and other types of sea food to countries such as China and other parts of South East Asia.
	is to preserve the fish as soon as possible in order to maintain its nutritional value, consumption quality and shelf life.
	Quality Exports uses the refrigeration and freezing technique of preserving fish. Students were acquainted with the area where the fish is first washed, segregated into cartons by weight and then stored in freezers. Several employees organized into assembly lines carry out this process in a hygienic manner.
	In order to prevent the fish from losing its freshness, it is stored in freezers having temperatures set to -180C and -400C. Students were also given a view of the same.
	Employees wearing insulated clothing load the boxes of frozen fish into
