

The talk concluded with the speaker and the moderator having a discussion on all the questions that were submitted by the participants.

Department of Geology

The Department of Geology organized a **“Student- Expert cum alumni interactive session”**. The session was organized on 11/12/2020 in online mode. The sessions were as follows:

- Vikas Peeru, Deputy Manager Exploration, Vedanta Ltd. He gave a deep insight into the exploratory phase of mining. He also did software demonstration on how geologists build geological model of the ore body using borehole data and how planning of next phase of drilling boreholes is done to build a complete model. He also shared his field experience of working in various projects in Liberia and discussed the challenges faced by a typical exploration geologist.
- Santosh Ghadi, Deputy Manager Mine Planning, Vedanta Ltd. He presented a complete overview of the Mining process in Goa from the mine site to the end user. He highlighted the various ways in which the mined land can be reclaimed after the mining operations have ceased. Using software demonstration he explained how a progressive mining plan is made. He also highlighted the various community social responsibility activities performed by the mining companies for the direct benefit of the mining affected communities. He also shared his experience of working in various deposits worldwide including copper deposits in Zambia and Zinc deposits in South Africa.

A question and answer session was held at the end of the presentations where both the speakers patiently addressed all the questions and enlightened the students on aspects such as mine land reclamation, issues in mining in Goa, Measures taken to prevent mine pollution, Job prospects in mining, educational qualifications, career paths etc. It was an enlightening session for all the participants of the Department of Geology.





Focusing on that, Mr Hede asked the alumni if they could contribute to the college and its students in terms of internships. The alumni had a lot to say and offer regarding the same. Mr Verlekar told us about the internships offered in the Goa University, which included internships at NIO, NCOR and IIRS which is in collaboration with ISRO. Students interested to work in the field of hydro-geo were sent to Vasco by




contacting the concerned person Mr. Smitesh Talwadkar. He suggested these internships would be of great benefit to the students. Mr Hede asked if we could allow students to work on projects and consider them as internships. Upon which Mr Verlekar had an innovative suggestion. He said we could have a project called Geo Heritage. To further explain this, he told us how a number of places in Goa needed to be protected as heritage. Places like Fort Aguada has unique ripple marks made on the rocks which are of great interest to geologists. He said places like Anmod Ghat, Paloem have the oldest rock found in the Asian subcontinent but unfortunately, they are not protected by anyone as they should be. Harvalem waterfall as well is an area with great geological heritage. He suggested if the students went to such places, only then the need to protect these heritages would be found. The students could document these areas, maintain the records in their thesis or could also write a booklet for the locals to understand the worth of these beautiful places.

Further Ms. Shetkar spoke about her experience in working with mangroves. She along with Ms. Andrea explained to us the need of mangrove protection. Ms Shetkar told us about her previous project and how drones were used in marking of the species. She said there is a lot to be discovered and learned in the area of mangroves. She said institutes like TERI are always keen on giving opportunities to students to work and learn more. She told us how MSI, that is Mangrove Society of India wants to chalk out an Atlas of Goa on mangroves. Projects like these could be a great opportunity for students to work and expand their knowledge. She said NIO, GSI, Goa state biodiversity board are willing to offer internships to students.

Later, the alumni spoke about their college activities with various groups and clubs and how engaging with the same could be beneficial to the students. Mr Verlekar told us about his participation in working with a group called 'MARG' and how they needed students for translation of certain scientific terms into Konkani. He suggested 'Konkani Bhasha Mandal' for Konkani enthusiasts as they are looking for people to work on children's literature. He



also suggested organisations like 'Parikrama Knowledge Terminus', local youth clubs, rotary clubs where students could get involved into various projects according to their likings.

Lastly, before winding up the session, ideas for future alumni meet were discussed. The alumni said such meets should be held at least twice a semester, or even better if all the alumni were called on one fixed day and time once a month. One fixed slot can be allotted every month for a meet where such interesting and informative talks can take place. With this the session was wound up. Mr. Hede thanked each everyone present in the room for taking out the time and joining us. The alumni were then taken to the canteen for tea and snacks.

Thus, the first alumni meet gave us a great opportunity to interact with the alumni about their respective fields. It also gave them an opportunity to get back to the college by providing us with such information which is definitely going to benefit the students, thus making this event a great success.

Report on Chowgule College Alumni Reunion 2015




