Summary of the	A clean up drive was organised under the Community Outreach

	Mangrove Cleaning Drive: The site chosen was at Borim near Chowgule Shipyard. Approximately 300 meters of the stretch of the mangroves was cleaned. Mangrove forests provide multiple provisioning, regulating and recreational ecosystem services, but they are most valued for their role in coastal protection. To prevent deterioration, this cleaning drive was a small effort to evade major problems in future. Plastic was the major component degrading the magroves in Borim. The studnets also spoke to the people working and living around that area about the importance of mangrove conservation.  Beach Cleaning Drive: The students conducted cleaning drive at the colva beach. Besides, they spoke the locals and tourists to create

Summary of the	50 shops and restaurants were surveyed through questionnaire on

	plastic content in nature and related diseases and health problems. It is	
	important to educate people and make them aware of its deleterious	
	effects of it on the environment. To spread awareness and know about	
	people's thoughts and choices on single-use plastic, the students carried	
	out the awareness drive. They were informed about the toxic effects of	
	single-use plastic and whether they support a ban on it if the	
	government issues an ordinance. A lot of people had positive opinions	
	regarding this issue and were proud of their eco-friendly choices while	
	some followed inappropriate waste disposal and plastic usage patterns.	
	Students informed them about choices that they could practice daily to

	wide range of habitats ranging from rural to urban areas. They are	


