This has reference to the proposal submitted by Parvatibai Chowgule College of Arts and Science, P.O. Fatorda Gogol, Margao, Goa-403 602 affiliated to Goa University for extension of autonomous status under the UGC Scheme for Autonomous Colleges.

As per the decision of the Standing Committee constituted by University Grants Commission, in its meeting held on 03.12.2021, the Competent Authority has decided to extend the autonomous status to **Parvatibai Chowgule College of Arts and Science, P.O. Fatorda Gogol, Margao, Goa-403 602** affiliated to **Goa University** for a period of Five (05) years from the session 2021-2022 to 2025-2026, including ex-post-facto approval for the period 2020-2021 as per provisions of Clause 3.13 and Clause 6.3 of UGC Regulations dated 12.02.2018.

The University is requested to issue necessary notification/order regarding extension of autonomous status to the College as per the UGC (Conferment of Autonomous Status Upon Colleges and Measures for Maintenance of Standards in Autonomous Colleges) Regulations, 2018 for Autonomous Colleges. The College, if eligible, shall apply for autonomy grant as per the norms laid down in the Regulations.

The Autonomous College is required to abide by all the provisions of the UGC Regulations for Autonomous Colleges. The Regulations are available on the UGC website, www.ugu.ac.in. Non compliance of the requirements and conditions in the said Regulations shall attract action as per Clause -14 of the UGC Regulations – 2018. Further, it may be noted that the above said college shall also apply in the prescribed format to University Grants Commission for extension of autonomous status six months prior to the expiry of the autonomous cycle.

II. Background of the College with Vision, Mission and Objectives

Goa was liberated from Portuguese rule of 450 years in December 1961. Access to Higher Education was not available to the youths of Goa at that time. It was in June 1962, Smt. Parvatibai Chowgule Cultural Foundation's College of Arts & Science was started by Chowgule Education Society (C.E.S.). Initially, the college was offering Undergraduate Programmes, B.A. in English, Marathi, Hindi, French, Portuguese, Economics, History, Philosophy and Geography and B.Sc. in Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics and Botany.

Now as on today, college is offering programmes at Undergraduate and Postgraduate levels and Ph.D. Parvatibai Chowgule College is accredited by NAAC with Grade 'A' (CGPA of 3.41 on a 4-point scale on the 3rd cycle) in the year 2014. Adjudged by Goa University as the Best Affiliated College at the time of its Silver Jubilee celebrations in the year 2009, it was also conferred with the Best Educational Institute award by Business Goa in 2014.

Having been conferred the autonomous status by University Grants Commission in June 2014, this college is the first autonomous college in the State of Goa. Our recent achievements include, the college being placed in Rank band '101-150' in National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) conducted by the Ministry of Education (MoE), Government of India in the year 2018, subsequently placed in the Rank Band of 151-200 in the years 2019 and 2021. The college was selected under DBT Star Scheme of Government of India and honoured with the 'Best Internship Partner award' by Goa Rugby Union at the Goa Rugby Awards 2018.

Our College is categorized as 'Band A' institution (Rank between 06-25) in category of 'Institutes and Colleges (Government and Government Aided)' in Atal Ranking of Institutions on Innovation Achievement (ARIIA) 2020 announced by Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) Government of India, in 2020. We have also been rated at '4.5 Star' for undertaking various activities prescribed by Innovation Cell, Ministry of Education, Government of India to promote innovation and start-ups in campus during the IIC Calendar Year, 2019-20.

Since its inception, the College has always been at the forefront in educational innovation. In 1986, the College pioneered computer science education in Goa by starting a Postgraduate Diploma in Computer Applications. In 2004, the College initiated Postgraduate programmes in Information Technology (M.Sc.) and Geography (M.A.). In subsequent years, on the basis of prevalent societal needs, courses in Biotechnology (B.Sc.) and Psychology (B.A.) were introduced at Undergraduate level, and Postgraduate Diplomas in Geoinformatics (P.G.D.G.I.S.) and Human Genetics & Pathological Techniques (P.G.D.H.G.P.T.) were started. The College now offers courses leading to Postgraduate diploma in Clinical Genetics & Medical Lab Techniques (P.G.D.C.G.M.L.T.), M.A. in Applied Economics, Hindi, Child Psychology and Child Development and English. We also offer M.Sc. in Analytical Chemistry, and Geoinformatics (G.I.S.). The College also offers Ph.D. programmes in Hindi and Geography. The college introduced Bachelor of Vocational

courses (B.Voc.) in Software Development in 2017-18 and Multimedia and Digital Filmmaking, 3D Media and Virtual Reality-VFX, in 2018-19. Today, the College has twenty-seven undergraduate and eight post-graduate departments, offering a wide variety of programmes and courses, some of which are unique in Goa.

Recent Developments

The Chowgule Education Society (C.E.S.) has initiated massive infrastructural development at the College. As a result of this, state-of-the-art infrastructure is available for curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. The infrastructure added over the last ten years includes: science laboratory block, multimedia-equipped auditoriums, classrooms, conference room, campus-wide Wi-Fi network, additional computer labs, web-based virtual infrastructure for teaching-learning (C-LAAP/Google Classrooms, C-mail, Online Library), computerized library, well equipped staff rooms, FIFA accredited football ground with field turf, multipurpose ground, gymnasium and fitness centre, sports medicine and physiotherapy centre, open-air seating arrangements, new canteen, well maintained restrooms, spacious well-laid four-wheeler and two-wheeler parking space and new administrative offices. The entire campus and the administrative buildings have been refurbished. Many of the science departments have research laboratories to carry out extensive and specialized research.

This institution also renders various services that seek to provide motivation for students to excel. These support services include the Office of Information Technology, Estate Office, Student Support Services, Tiger's Sports School and Centralized Printing Facilities.

Two prominent student guidance facilities available at the College are: Staff Advisory Programme (mentoring) and Student Support Services. Mentoring of students is an integral part of our educational system, providing guidance and encouragement. Mentors play a key role in this college as they nurture students and help them remain connected and engaged, thus strengthening their performance. Student Support Services of our College has various arms such as the Writing Centre, Career & Personal Counseling Centre (CPCC), Business English Certificate (BEC) Training, Statistical Analysis Support Service (SASS), and Centre for Portuguese Language & Culture (CPLC).

The college has established a Centre for Teaching and Learning in 2017-18 which aims to educate faculty on how to go about integrating ICT in Higher Education effectively by conducting workshops, seminars and provide them with hands-on experience/training, innovate, implement and share different ICT tools in teaching. The college also has a Translation Centre which is first of its kind in Goa to promote the growth of indigenous literature and knowledge, induce the students to the field of translation and assignment of translation work.

The College has Memorandum of Understanding and collaborations with many foreign and Indian educational institutes. The College has an ongoing international student-teacher exchange programme with institutions of higher learning in Sweden, Japan and Portugal.

Observations of the Committee XVII.

Parvatibai Chowgule College of Arts and Science is a multi-faculty coeducational College, located in Marmgao, Goa. The College is offering programmes at Undergraduate (27) and Postgraduate (8) and Ph.D. levels, including a wide variety of programmes and some courses which are unique in Goa. The College is accredited by NAAC with Grade 'A' (CGPA of 3.41 on a 4-point scale on the 3rd cycle) in the year 2014. The College has submitted the Self Study Report (SSR) to NAAC for fourth cycle.

The College is the first and only autonomous college at present in the State of Goa, having been conferred the autonomous status by UGC in 2014. The college was selected under DBT Star Scheme of Government of India and honoured with the 'Best Internship Partner award' by Goa Rugby Union at the Goa Rugby Awards 2018. In 2018, the college figured in Rank band '101-150' in National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) conducted by the Ministry of Education (MoE), Government of India. In 2019 and 2021 the College was placed in the Rank Band of 151-200.

In 2020, as part of the Atal Ranking of Institutions on Innovation Achievement (ARIIA) 2020 of Ministry of Education, Government of India, in 2020. The College has been categorized as 'Band A' institution (Rank between 06-25) in category of 'Institutes and Colleges (Government and Government Aided)' . The College has also been rated at '4.5 Star' for undertaking various activities prescribed by Innovation Cell, Ministry of Education, Government of India to promote innovation and start-ups in campus during the IIC Calendar Year, 2019-20.

The Colleges has a state-of-the-art infrastructure for curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. The infrastructure added over the last ten years includes: science laboratory block, multimedia-equipped auditoriums, classrooms, conference room, campus-wide Wi-Fi network, additional computer labs, web-based virtual infrastructure for teaching-learning (C-LAAP/Google Classrooms, C-mail, Online Library), computerized library, well equipped staff rooms.

The Colleges has FIFA accredited artificial football ground with field turf, multipurpose ground, gymnasium and fitness centre, sports medicine and physiotherapy centre, open-air seating arrangements. Canteen, well maintained rest-rooms, spacious well-laid four-wheeler and two-wheeler parking space and new administrative offices. The entire campus and the administrative buildings have been refurbished. Many of the science departments have research laboratories to carry out extensive and specialized research.

As part of its Student Support Services, the College offers a Staff Advisory Programme (mentoring) and Student Support Services for providing guidance and encouragement to students. Mentors play a key role in this college as they nurture students and help them remain connected and engaged, thus strengthening their performance. Student Support Services of the College has various arms such as the Writing Centre, Career & Personal Counseling Centre (CPCC), Business English Certificate (BEC) Training, Statistical Analysis Support Service (SASS), and Centre for Portuguese Language & Culture (CPLC).

The Centre for Teaching and Learning set up with RUSA grants has a ICT Lab, AV studio, Touchboard TV and a Flipped Classroom. The Centre has adopted cooperative and Collaborative learning strategies, for capacity building of students and teachers in integrating ICT in Higher Education. Different types of Teaching, learning and Evaluation techniques have been employed which helps students in critical thinking and analysis. s The Translation Centre at the College, is first of its kind in Goa to promote the growth of indigenous literature and knowledge, induce the students to the field of translation and assignment of translation work.

The College has entered into MoUs and collaborations with many foreign and Indian educational institutes and has ongoing international student-teacher exchange programme with institutions of higher learning in Sweden, Japan and Portugal.

XVIII. Suggestions of the Committee

- The College needs to take immediate steps to appoint a regular Principal.
- 2. The College should set up a Task Force to prepare an action plan for implementation of NEP 2020.
- 3. College premises should have barrier free access for Divyangjan.
- The College needs to make arrangements for hostel and transportation facilities for students.
- 5. The arrangement of books in the Library needs to be reorganized to allow students easy access to books.
- Students should be given preference to use the football ground, the cricket ground and the gymnasium facilities without any hassles. Use of these facilities for commercial purposes should be avoided.
- 7. Digitisation of records should be inititiated on priority basis.
- 8. Basic Amenties as follows should be available in the college premises:
 - Sufficient number of water coolers i)
 - Sufficient number of Fire Extinguishers to be installed. ii)
 - iii) Bio safety equipment to be installed in the laboratories
 - Bio-medical waste management required as per DBT guidelines. iv)

- Sanitary pad dispensers and incinerators to be installed in all ladies washrooms and should be maintained regularly.
- 9. Placement and internship cells to be strengthened.
- 10. Continous Capacity building and faculty development programmes to be conducted.

 - Incorporation of in built security features in the certificate and marksheet ii)
 - CGPA conversion formula in the marksheet. iii)
 - Timely declaration of results iv)
- 11 Alumni assosciation to be formed at college level.
- 12 The College should participate in national Flagship programmes like Atmanirbhar Bharat, Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, Swacch Bharat, Azadi ka Amrut Mahotsav, Beti Bachao-Beti Padhaao, SWAYAM, NAD and Academic Bank of Credits.
- 13 There is scope to further improve the research infrastructure to promote better quality research.
- 14 The College needs to support consultancy projects.
- 15 IQAC needs to be strengthened

Recommendations of the Committee XIX.

The college has effectively made use of the autonomy given earlier and showed good progress in improving academic standards. The College has made conscious efforts to improve quality in setting up infrastructure and in using innovative teaching learning methods. Given an opportunity to continue with autonomy, the committee is convinced that the college can do better in the coming years. In light of the aforesaid observations of the peer-team visit to the college, the Committee recommends the extension of Autonomous status from 2020-2021 to 2025-2026.






