A preliminary comparative analysis of soil microbes in Goa and Sweden

The project was aimed at conducting a preliminary microbial analysis of soil samples from Sweden and Goa and to compare the microbial colonies formed along specific parameters. It was interesting to note that while the microbial colonies from soil samples in both countries displayed similarities in size, texture and pigmentation, there were differences in the type of margin and in the optical property, indicating that the species found in these regions vary from each other. Further characterization tests would reveal information with respect to Gram character, biochemical nature, motility and other characteristics of the soil microbes.

While interacting with the students, Pawar said, "We have to accept that education is not only for procurement of jobs. Under the leadership of Prime

Minister Narendra Modi, the government is giving emphasis on skill development. The country also has independent Union Ministry for Skill Development. With improvement of skills, avenues for getting jobs widened and any one can become independent entrepreneur.

The government he said is giving emphasis on skill development adding, "The entrepreneurs can set up their own ventures where they will be in a position to give jobs to others."

Pawar also informed students that the Goa government has developed Chief Minister Rojgar Yojana which provides financial assistance to youths of the state to start busi-

ness. The government is also providing free education till higher secondary. Swedish cuisines and food preservation techniques

Sweden is known as the land of Scandinavia and its climate and location are largely responsible for the development of its cuisine. In the olden days, the Swedes stocked their food supplies as a preparatory step before the long cold winters by preserving meats, fishes, fruits and vegetables.

Scandinavia was inhabited more than one thousand years ago by the Vikings. It was the Vikings who were some of the first ones to develop a method for preserving foods. In preparation for a long distance journey, many of the foods were compressed, salted and cured. Today modern-day technologies like using the refrigerator, freezer, ozone spray drying and use of chemical preservatives has eliminated the need for such traditional preservation methods of foods. Swedes still continue salting, dehydrating, smoking and curing many of their foods, particularly fish.

The Vikings embarked on trade all across Europe during 800AD to 1050AD. Over time, various foods such as French sauces, soups and tea from England and honey cakes from Germany were brought back to the Scandinavian territories and incorporated into their regular diet. Swedes still find soups a great way to use their leftovers.

These days restaurants in Sweden tend to serve more international dishes than their traditional ones. Historically, Swedish cuisine has not been popular but may be responsible for introducing frankfurters, smoked meats, cream soups and herring. The Swedes use a variety of methods to store and preserve prepared food items for longer durations. During our study, as part of the International Exchange Programme of Parvatibai Chowgule College, I came across



several traditional and modern techniques of food preservation practices that have been passed on from generation to generation. These techniques involve simple refrigeration, oven drying and pickling along with the use of preservatives like sodium benzoate, salt, sugar etc.

Various types of spices and nuts are stored in huge wooden cabinets in tightly packed closed containers to avoid rancidity and breads are wrapped in plain paper to

avoid spoilage. Swedes experience extremely cold climatic conditions from the months of November to March, which makes it necessary for them to preserve various types of meats. The sample survey conducted by our group showed that 86 per cent Swedes use these methods of preservation. Another unique aspect of their preservation method is the piling up of meat outside their homes in open spaces which gets frozen. Thin slices of the meat are cut and used as and when required a practice followed till to-day. The growth of microorganisms that are responsible for change in the flavour, texture, pH, oxidation-reduction potential, rancid potential of food items, is curbed due to the lower temperatures (0°C to 15°C). Even fruits and vegetables like cornish potatoes, bananas, green apples, garlic, ginger, etc. are stored in open spaces of apartments and villa's exposed to outer environmental conditions to maintain their texture and avoid food spoilage. Pickled herring is used in a classic recipe called Classolover's her-



ring and is also popularly known as Glasrestorill. Cured salted herring (this is pickled using vinegar, water, sugar, bay leaf and all ground spices, red onion, carrot and salt. Small flat like salted sardines and smoked whitefish are also pickled this way and consumed as a traditional appetiser. Almost 83.64 per cent Swedes include this dish in their regular diet.

Vinegar-cured salmon commonly known as knäck is in Sweden. It is mostly prepared using boiled salmon, together with onion and carrots, in a mixture of pickling liquid containing water, vinegar, salt, sugar and flour spices like bay leaf, cloves and cinnamon. This dish is consumed chilled along with mayonnaise spiced with dill (locally known as 'shepv' ball, a rich source of iron and essential minerals) and lemon.

Crab-cake is a Swedish dish con-

sisting of raw salmon, cured in salt, sugar and oil, which is usually served as an appetiser, most commonly prepared by fishermen during the middle ages. The fishermen preserve salted and fermented salmon by burying it deep inside the sand. These days fermentation is no longer used in the production process but instead the salmon is buried in a dry mixture of salt,

sugar and dill and cured for a few days. Moisture turns the dry curing into a concentrated brine which can also be used as a part of sauce. Swedish hard bread commonly known as knäckebröd is a crisp, hard bread prepared using Swedish rye (a grain closely related to barley and wheat), both finely ground or coarse. This hard bread is rolled out to thin, flat cakes with a blunt, soaked rolling-pin, leaving a pattern. The rolled out cakes are then baked at a very high temperature

(250°C - 300°C) for a short while and then allowed to air dry which helps preserve the bread for about three months. Knäckebröd is baked and stored in big wheels with poles in the centre of the cabin hanging upside down. Swedes consider this the healthiest bread and snack on them at any time of the day.

The study conducted through this International Exchange Programme has enabled the understanding of the fundamental differences in food preservation techniques used in India and Sweden. These differences stem mainly from the differences in climatic conditions, which result in changes in parameters (pH, texture, colour, odour, taste, etc.) of food due to the inactive state or over-activity of microbial life.


**ADDENDUM TO THE MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN
PARVATIBAI CHOWGULE COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCE
AND
WASEDA UNIVERSITY**

In order to further strengthen the cooperation between Parvatibai Chowgule College of Arts and Science, which is autonomous, and Waseda University we hereby agree to establish the following reciprocal student exchange program based upon principles of mutual benefit.

1. Each year, during the term of this Addendum, one institute may send up to one student, either undergraduate or graduate, to be enrolled at the other institute. It is understood that a balance in the number of students exchanged shall be sought over a five year period.
2. Students will be selected by their home institute on the basis of academic merit and suitability for study at the host institute. The names and details of the students shall be submitted to the host institute beforehand for approval. The host institute reserves the right to reject candidates, in which case additional candidates may be proposed.
3. Exchange students shall be enrolled as non-degree students at the host institute with credit to be transferred back to the home institute. The duration of the students' stay shall be one academic year. Transcripts will be provided to the home institute.
4. Exchange students shall be subject to the rules and regulations of the host institute and country. They will also have the rights and privileges enjoyed by all students of the host institute.
5. Exchange students shall be entitled to participate in any pre-academic courses or programmes that are arranged for foreign students at the host institute.
6. Exchange students shall pay whatever fees required of them by their home institute in order to participate in the programme and shall be exempt from paying tuition and academic fees to the host institute.
7. Each institute shall make every reasonable effort to assist exchange students in finding suitable accommodation. The payment of housing costs and payment for all travel, medical insurance and subsistence costs shall be the responsibility of the individual student participating in the programme and neither institute held liable for such charges. Students selected shall satisfy the home institute that they have adequate funds for transportation to and from the home institute and for subsistence during their stay.
8. Centre for International Exchange Programmes of Parvatibai Chowgule College of Arts and Science and the Center for International Education of Waseda University shall be the offices responsible for the administration of this student exchange programme.
9. This Addendum shall become effective on the date of signing for five years. It shall be renewed every five (5) years thereafter upon the mutual written consent of both parties. Either party may choose to terminate this Addendum by written notification to the other party. Termination will become effective six (6) months after the notification is received by the other party.





considering the importance of establishing cultural and scientific exchanges, which could contribute to the progress and encounter to different cultures;

considering that both institutions are bound with the same interests and objectives in the academic and cultural fields;

considering that universities are institutions called by the essence, goals and objectives, to establish communication channels, which would allow to exchange cultural and scientific knowledge;

agree to establish the following formal cultural and scientific agreement.

ARTICLE 1

The two institutions agree to the following objectives:

1. Increase the scientific and cultural relationship;
2. Further the development of mutual collaboration;
3. Exchange of information, materials and scientific information in those fields which are of interest to both institutions;
4. Promote teaching and researching in fields of mutual interest;
5. Promote the mobility of teachers, staff, researchers and students between both institutions;
6. Curriculum development;
7. Preparation of joint research projects;
8. Participation in seminars and academic meetings;
9. Exchange of accreditation procedures and standards.

ARTICLE 2

The two institutions agree to identify specific areas of collaboration and to design projects of academic collaboration that shall be determined by mutual accord in writing (addendums) and will not exceed the validity of the present agreement.

ARTICLE 3

Matters arising in relation to the implementation of the joint academic projects shall be negotiated and dealt with between the two institutions on a case-by-case basis.

All the expenses in executing the agreement will be negotiated and subject to the approval of the involved faculties, schools, institutes or departments of both institutions.

ARTICLE 4

The University of Porto appoints Prof. Maria de Fatima Aires Pereira Marinho Saraiva and Prof. Isabel Margarida Ribeiro de Oliveira Duarte, of the Faculty of Arts of the University of Porto, and Parvatibai Chowgule College of Arts and Science appoints Mr. Ashok Dinkar Dange and Ms. Sharmila Menezes, as Coordinators of the Projects of collaboration to be developed under this Addendum. Each Coordinator must present an annual activities report to the Rector of home Institution.

ARTICLE 5

The present agreement becomes effective on the date of its signature and is valid for the period of five (5) years after which it will be automatically terminated.

The agreement may be renewed upon mutual written consent by both institutions at least six (6) months prior to the date of termination.

ARTICLE 6


Any modification to the present agreement shall be undertaken by mutual decision in writing and any new changes will start on a date agreed by both institutions.



Hereinafter jointly referred to as "the Partner Universities",

Driven by a common desire to establish and develop closer cooperation links in the fields of higher education and research,

Considering the legislative and regulatory provisions governing cooperation in the fields of higher education, scientific and technical research and culture, between the government of the French Republic and The Republic of India,

Agree upon the following provisions:

Article 1 – Cooperation

In compliance with the legislative and regulatory provisions in force in each of the institutions and in their respective countries, the Université de La Réunion and Parvatibai Chowgule College of Arts and Science (Autonomous) agree to foster the cooperations in the following fields:

1. Exchanges of teaching and research staff
2. Exchanges of students
3. Exchanges of technical and administrative staff according to specific needs,
4. Development of joint training programmes
5. Development of joint research programmes
6. Joint scientific supervision of research activities (joint supervision or direction of these as appropriate)
7. Facilitation of access to pedagogical and scientific knowledge (exchanges of documentation and publications)
8. Joint organisation of colloquia, conferences, seminars and short training courses (summer courses)
9. Participation in any type of exchange likely to promote their establishments and staff, whether in the framework of their internal operations or in the context of relationships with their economic, industrial, social or cultural environment
10. Other forms of cooperation: new teaching products, e-learning, support for the implementation of new research structures, etc.

Article 2 – Scope of the agreement

The cooperation may concern any academic fields common to both partner universities.

On an annual basis, the universities shall exchange any information and any non-confidential documentation that will allow them to carry out the envisaged cooperation in addition to the exchange programme, where applicable.

Article 3 – Implementing conventions

The provisions relating to the activities provided for in articles 1 and 2 shall be jointly defined and shall be covered by specific implementing conventions according to the components and/or academic fields concerned.

These conventions shall specify the aims, contents, the staff involved and the pedagogical, administrative and financial procedures for the implementation of the bases of cooperation described in articles 1 and 2. These same additional agreements shall also mention the assessment and monitoring procedures and their frequency.

The implementing conventions may be updated on a regular basis as required. They shall be signed by the representatives of both partner universities.

Article 4 - Resources

The Parvatibai Chowgule College of Arts and Science (Autonomous) and the University of Reunion Island will try to foresee some of the means required for the carrying out of the present MoU and to obtain supplementary means.

Both parties understand that all the financial arrangements will have to be negotiated in advance and will depend on the availability of funds. They will give place to the establishment of a financial appendix and approved by the proper authorities of each of the institutes.

Article 5 – Exchanges of information - Confidentiality

Any information that is gathered or exchanged in the framework of the cooperation activity, including during scientific visits, in addition to the results of joint research or of jointly developed techniques, shall be confidential and cannot be disclosed to third parties without the prior, written authorisation of each of the partner universities.

The Parties undertake that any information exchanged in the framework of cooperation activities, which is identified as being confidential:

- a) Shall be kept strictly confidential and treated with the same level of protection that is afforded to their own confidential information
- b) Shall only be transmitted to members of staff that need to be aware of this information and shall only be used in application of the agreement, for a period of five years from the date of its transmission

Any other transmission or use of confidential information implies the prior consent of the Party that transmitted it Each Party undertakes that its staff referred to in b) above shall comply with

the provisions of the Convention

Notwithstanding the above-mentioned provisions, each Party may transmit confidential information that it can prove:

- To have been publicly available prior to its transmission or after it, but in the absence of any fault for which the Party can be deemed responsible
- To have been received from a third party in a lawful manner
- To have already been in its possession before entering into the agreement
- To have been developed independently and in good faith by members of its staff that did not have access to this confidential information.

Furthermore, these provisions cannot preclude:

- The obligation incumbent on each person participating in the cooperation to produce an activity report at his or her parent institution, insofar as this transmission of information does not constitute a disclosure as defined by the laws on industrial property
- The defence of a thesis relating to the subject of the cooperation; whenever necessary, this defence needs to be organised in such a way as to guarantee the confidentiality of certain results of work carried out in the framework of the agreement, while conforming to the university regulations in force.

Article 6 – Intellectual property

For each project involving cooperation in the research field, the partner universities must ensure effective protection and the equitable sharing of intellectual property rights.

The following rules shall apply to the cooperation:

- In the framework of research projects, each partner university shall remain the sole holder of any intellectual property rights acquired previously or resulting from independent research.
- Results concerning projects not covered by the previous paragraph, conducted in the scientific fields described in the implementing conventions that are appended to the agreement and likely to be protected on grounds of intellectual property, shall be afforded protection on the following bases: if a patent is filed, both partner universities shall jointly examine the procedures for filing, extending and maintaining the property rights according to the respective intellectual and financial contributions of the Parties.
- Each of the Parties undertakes to respect the other Party's intellectual property rights. Specifically, the intellectual property rights resulting from any research or collaborative activity in the framework of this Agreement shall be examined on a case-by-case basis, and shall be the subject of measures officially established by both partners.
- The Partner Universities must keep one another informed about any results of work authored or invented by members of the Partner University, which may be protected by Intellectual Property rights.
- The Partner Universities must conform to the confidentiality requirements defined pursuant to their respective national legislation and by national agreements, with particular attention to Article 39 of the World Trade Organisation's Agreement on Trade-Related Aspects of Property Rights (TRIPS).

Article 7 – Scientific publications and papers

The publications and scientific papers envisaged by the staff of research teams involved in the cooperation shall be produced under the responsibility of their Directors. The said projects for publications and papers shall be brought to their attention in sufficient time to allow them to contact the Parties' departments in charge of commercial exploitation so that they can implement any protective measures that may be required.

The authors' affiliations in the said publications and communications must follow the rules for scientific signature in force in each institution.

Article 8 – Duration of the agreement, modification, cancellation and renewal

This cooperation agreement shall enter into force from the date of the last signature written by either of the Parties, subject to the approval of the competent authorities of each country when this is required. It is entered into for a five-year period.

Each partner university may request the modification of the agreement. Such a modification shall be made by means of an amendment drawn up by mutual agreement of the Parties, subject to the approval of the competent authorities of each country when this is required.

Either of the partner universities may request the cancellation of the agreement, subject to notifying the other university of its decision in writing with six months' notice. In the event of cancellation, the actions in progress shall continue until the end of the current academic year, at the latest.

This agreement may be renewed for a maximum period of 5 years, after the submission of a renewal application by either of the two Parties, within a period of six months preceding the expiration date of the agreement. If necessary, each renewal must be approved by the competent supervisory authorities.

If this agreement is not renewed, the actions in progress shall continue until the end of the current academic year, at the latest.

Article 9 – Settlement of disputes

The partner universities shall endeavour to settle any disputes that may arise during the execution or performance of this agreement on an amicable basis.

Should an amicable solution not be possible, the dispute will be brought before the relevant court governed by the law of the institute's country which seizes the justice to complain or lodge an appeal.

Article 10 – Text of the agreement

This agreement has been drawn up in four original copies of identical content, two of which are in the French language and two in the English language.
