

Discovery Gallery – Pride of India: A postercompetition on Discovery gallery focused on







Cardozo, SYBSc, Department of Biotechnology and Third place was bagged by Ms. Shreya Naik, TYBSc, Department of Zoology.




Siddhi Deelip Naik (S.Y.B.Sc.) bagged the 1st prize winner for Poster and receiving award




9.IDPD 2020 - A Psychological Perspective

The students also interacted with the speaker and spoke of ways in which they can create a difference and make this world a more inclusive place.





