Usman, Mr. Sairesh Amonkar and Ms. Melina Pereira won the first, second and third place, respectively.

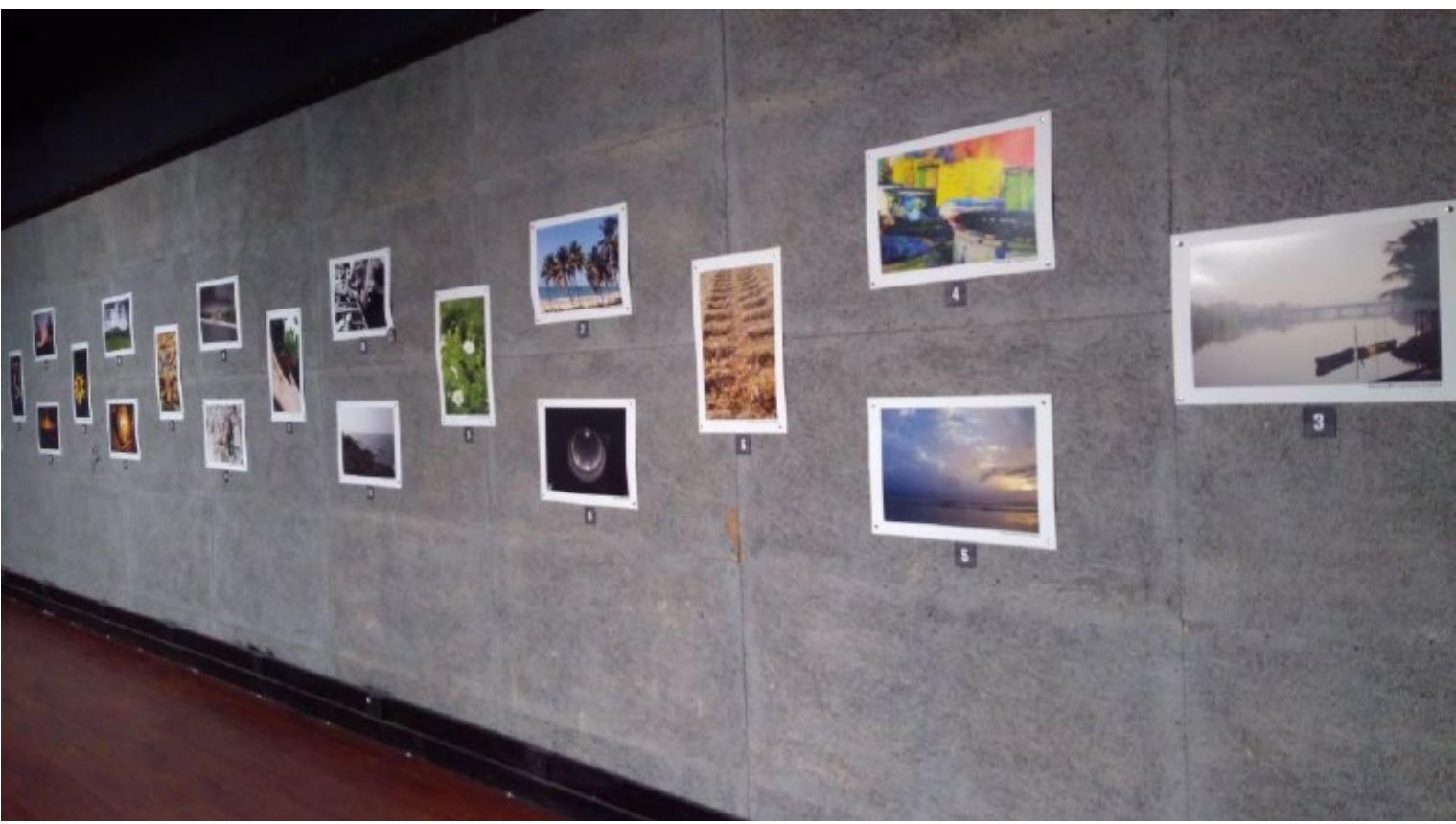

When the film’s trailer had released, movie buffs couldn’t stop going gaga about it. The long wait came to an end when the horror film was finally out in theatres on 11 August 2017. It shows film stars Stephanie Sigman, Taliha Bateman, Anthony LaPaglia and Miranda Otto depicting the possessed Annabelle doll’s origin.

‘Annabelle: Creation’ is set in the arid regions of USA, a nuclear family consisting of Samuel Mullins (Anthony LaPaglia), Esther Mullins (Miranda Otto) and their daughter Bee, live happily. Not ever after though because at a very young age, their only daughter dies. After trying out innumerable measures to get back their daughter’s spirit, the couple realises that they’ve actually bestowed themselves with a demon in the doll Annabelle, who wishes to possess the weakest in the house. Few years later, enter a group of orphaned girls, who are sheltered at the Mullins house along with a nun. Sandberg uses the technique of building suspense, in fact, horror, by using silence. The plot of the film is very basic but its progression is what makes it really interesting. It is shot well and the lighting in the whole movie is good in the moody scenes. 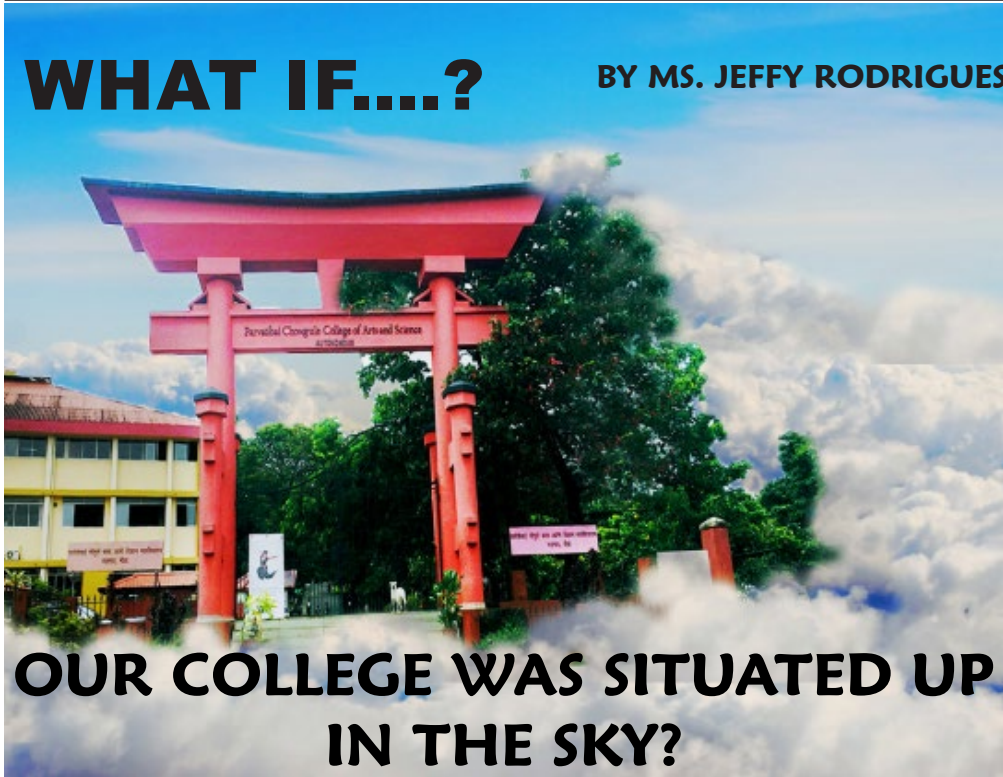
### OP-ED!
