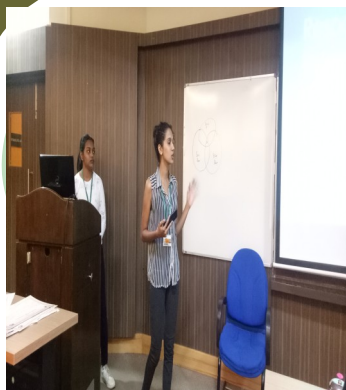
SEMINAR ON “STOCK MARKET”
