The Chamarel plain located in the Riviere Noire **District of south-western Mauritius** is famous all over the world for its Seven coloured earth. In fact, it is an area of sand dunes consisting of sand that has seven distinct colours.

As the sunlight hits the dunes, the seven colours can be seen visibly. The colours of the sand is a result of a difference in cooling of molten volcanic rock. The difference in cooling occurred when the different portions of the molten volcanic rock got cooled at different temperatures.
